The FN then recognized **Past Faithful Navigator Greg Verbick** for his great work during the 2016-2017 Fraternal Year.

And not being finished, he then presented the *Sir Knight of the Month* award to **Sir Knight Greg Hejna** for last year's good leadership as *Commander*.



In his report, the Faithful Comptroller announced that we are 'officially' at 317 Members, but come the end of the month that number will go to 322 when Supreme adds our 5 new Sir Knights to the roster. In his new seat as the Faithful Purser, Joe **Creasy** stated that we are solvent! Always a good thing to hear. Money for the Blue Mass is still coming in from Councils. It is imperative that all 14 Councils contribute as they can to make this a financial success, simply meaning we don't lose money. The **PFN** then gave a report on the Blue Mass Committee. As we have been saying it is definitely on for Saturday, September 23rd at St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton Church in Crystal Lake. The new flyers are out and each Council was asked to have it placed in their Parish's Sunday bulletin as soon as possible, and we should also post them on the Parish bulletin boards. The Committee is asking for a minimum of 6 Council members, 4th Degree or below, to sign-up as workers. We need ushers, cooks, servers, clean-up, parking lot valets, and you name it! Everyone in the Assembly Honor Guard is of course being asked to participate in Regalia. And the other good news is that **His Excellency** Bishop David Malloy will be the principal celebrant at the Mass. Although Confirmations are quite right now, there are still a couple of events. It's breakfast, and its being done by a Council generally. To raise funds... that should be all that we need to go, then get a few of the guys, with their families and car-pool or convoy on over. The host will be ecstatic so see his Brothers show up. And what about those Golf Outings we contribute to for a hole sponsor. How many play golf? Sure, it's a little more than just going, but it's for a good cause. We currently are sponsoring an outing on August 13th in Twin Lakes, WI, for one of the Councils, and another on September 12th Woodstock. We ask who is doing what at the meetings and need to be participating for our Brothers when we can. As a reminder, the next Fourth Degree Exemplification, the **Patriotic American** Catholic Degree, will be in October, in the Rock Falls / Dixon area. Last I head we don't have the details yet, but it is generally the 3rd Saturday in October for the fall. We had 5 new Sir Knights at the last degree. Can we possibly set a goal for 5 candidates at EVERY 4th Degree Exemplification this year??? All it takes is YOU! Let us know if you need a Form 4!
