On Saturday, September 22, 2018, the most recent 4th Degree Exemplification took place. This was held at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Huntley, IL, with our new Master presiding. These men have joined with 67 other noble Brother Knights in advancement to the Fourth Degree of the Order, The *Patriotic American Catholic Degree*. Congratulations to all and when you see one of our new Sir Knights, offer him your thanks and welcome him into the Assembly!

We also had **Sir Knight Jose Cazares**, a new member of the Assembly in attendance for the first time and he was introduced and presented his Fourth Degree Certificate and name badge.

Are you aware that **The Bishop Boylan Assembly** consists of over 310 Sir Knights, not counting the 10 new Sir Knights not yet on the Supreme Roster?

We are made up of 14 different Councils. There are Councils with over 40 Sir Knights in their ranks. We, the Fourth Degree, have been called 'aging' in relationship to overall members. I remember when I became a Fourth Degree back in 1998 along with over 20 3rd Degree Members of my Council. I went to my first meeting which started earlier than our Council meetings and ended quickly. When I came home early, my wife asked why? since our Council meetings where much longer. I explained because most of the members at the meeting won't drive when it gets dark out! I laughed about it then... although by now I guess I'm one of those! LOL!!! But, each time there is an Exemplification, more and more of the new SKs are young men... and not just because I am getting older, but they are joining. And getting involved. We are truly blessed with so many men today, young men, who are answering the call to advance to the Fourth. It is our duty to ask our fellow Brothers to become Sir Knights, just as it is when a new Brother is inducted into the Order we tell him, Congratulations, thanks for joining, and, oh, here is a Form 100, go get someone else! In view of all that is happening in our parishes, our communities, our country and the world, we need Catholic soldiers to carry on... following the banner of Columbus to spread the word, and to show the world the beauty and devotion of the Catholic man.



September also saw the McHenry County Prayer Breakfast. The celebrant was *His Eminence Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann, D.D.,* from the Archdiocese of Chicago. The Assembly was proud to provide an Honor Guard for the Archbishop.

During the business meeting, **Past Faithful Navigator Greg Verbick**, currently serving as a Trustee, was presented an award by the **Faithful Navigator** for his tireless efforts as Chairman of the *Second Annual Blue Mass*. A recap was given about the September 8th event by Greg. The First Responders were extremely grateful for the support and prayers of the Knights, and the attendance was larger than last year, a very good sign of our commitment.

The only Honor Guard call outs for the past month had been for the Prayer Breakfast and the Blue Mass, but we are starting to get into the time of Confirmations. If you are an Honor Guard member with full Regalia, please be sure that the **Faithful Captain** and **Commanders** have your email info so that you can receive the notices for call outs. We can expect the first in a few weeks as the season begins. If you miss the e-mail and don't see it posted on our web page, **Faithful Commander Don May** reminds us that the Bishop's schedule is always printed in the **Observer** and can be read as a back-up.

During the meeting we always have a list of upcoming events at the Councils, as well as a list of sick and distressed members in need of prayers. Of course, our daily prayers should always include our Brother Knights and especially our Clergy. Several comments where made at the Fourth Degree Exemplification about now is a very important time to be praying for our clergy as the entire Catholic Church is in this time of upheaval. It is a daily occurrence that news casts and print are filled with story after story of these terrible atrocities. And it is certainly right that they see the light of day... but remember that like the old "juvenile delinquents" from back in the day, as terrible as this is, it is the few bad apples that are getting the press. we must remember and hold close to our hearts that it is a vast minority of the clergy that are guilty... we need to keep close all the good and holy priests that are out there and in our lives that are being lumped into a large bucket who need our support more than ever.
