KNOW YOUR FAITH

Annunciation of the Lord

The Feast of the Annunciation commemorates the visit of the Archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, during which he informed her that she would be the mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is celebrated on 25 March each year approximately 9 months prior to Christmas. In the Roman Catholic Church, when 25 March falls during the Paschal Triduum, it is transferred forward to the first suitable day during Eastertide. It is a major Marian feast, classified as a solemnity in the Catholic Church. Two examples in liturgical Christianity of the importance attached to the Annunciation are the Angelus prayer, and the event's position as the first Joyful Mystery of the Rosary.



Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday commemorates the day when Jesus entered the city of David; riding on a donkey and greeted by the faithful bearing palms shouting “Hosanna in the highest!” Today’s faithful commemorate the reenactment of Jesus entering Jerusalem by carrying palms into Churches and the Gospel readings include the story of Jesus’ final days. Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week

Easter

Easter, also called Pascha, commemorates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day after His burial following His crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary in 30 AD. It is the culmination of the Passion of Jesus, preceded by Lent. It is the basis of our Catholic faith, and all teachings and beliefs we learn from the Catholic Church, are based on this most important and significant event.



Divine Mercy Sunday

In the 1930’s a Polish nun, Faustina Kowalska, reported visions and visitations from Jesus Christ and conversations with Him. He asked her to paint the vision of His merciful divinity being poured from His sacred heart and specifically asked for a feast of Divine Mercy to be established on the first Sunday after Easter so Mankind would take refuge in Him.

The feast of Divine Mercy, according to the diary of St. Faustina, receives from Jesus the biggest promises of Grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy, in particular that a person who goes to sacramental confession and receives holy communion on that day, shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment. That means, each person would go immediately after death to Heaven without suffering in purgatory or hell.

In 2000, Pope John Paul II officially designated the Sunday after Easter thereafter as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy in the General Roman Calendar

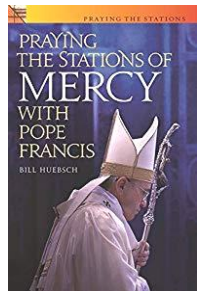

DO NOT TRAVEL ELSEWHERE WITH THE RELIC- IT MUST STAY AT YOUR HOME FOR THE DURATION OF THE PILGRIMAGE! This relic is our Assembly's greatest treasure that was donated to us by our founder several months before he was received into Heaven. We will not have it lost, stolen, damaged, defaced, etc.
- On the week beginning where the Assembly has a meeting (3rd Tuesday of the month) - the Sunday prior- the relic must return to the program chairman or Faithful Navigator so that it is available for the ceremonials. The relic will be able to travel once again to Sir Knights on the 1st Sunday FOLLOWING the Assembly meeting.
- The relic will be stored in a chest along with hand sanitizer, a pack of white gloves for handling, silk cloth, cushion, and prayer cards to the Saint. You are welcomed to take as many as you wish for you and others to keep. Free will donations will be gratefully accepted to help replenish our supplies.

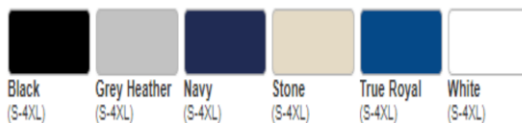

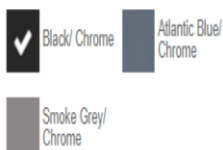
