Wreaths Across America

Last year, our Assembly as well as other Assemblies and Councils purchased wreaths for some graves of veterans.

This year, SK John Alese signed up our Assembly as a Wreaths Across America official group supporting the Arizona Veterans Memorial Cemetery at Marana.



Our objective is to support the cemetery's goal of a wreath for all 1,900 veterans interred at the cemetery; as of this month, over 600 wreaths have been purchased by sponsors from various organizations.

Hawaiian Shirts for Deployed Soldiers

On a lighter note, SK Jim Hackett [Past Grand Knight] (PGK) of Council #10441 one of the Councils affiliated with our Assembly] launched our support of a non-profit organization providing Hawaiian Shirts for Deployed Soldiers.

It started in March 2017 with a mom, Gwen Pollard, sending a Hawaiian shirt to her son deployed from Fort Campbell, Kentucky, with the 101st Airborne Division. He came out (on an undisclosed site) in a Hawaiian shirt and the soldiers laughed. Some wished that they had one, so he asked her to send a few for him and his buddies. Now, the goal is shipping 100,000 Hawaiian shirts to deployed soldiers with a handwritten note of encouragement tucked in each shirt pocket.

Working with Gail Neer, wife of late PFN Bill Neer, we are collecting new, thrift store and gently used Hawaiian shirts.

Fisher House Program

Our 4th (actually 1st – having been around for several years) Patriotic Program is preparing meals for the guests at the Fisher House.

In 2016, the only Fisher House in Arizona opened on the campus of Tucson's VA Hospital to provide a place where military and veterans families can stay while a loved one is in the hospital or any other Tucson medical facility.

Soon thereafter, under the leadership of our Faithful Navigator at that time, the now late SK Bill Neer, SKs and wives have been supporting the Fisher House by preparing meals every 4th Wednesday of each month.



Today, PFN Randy Hannon leads the group of merry chefs and sous chefs. The Fisher House Foundation is a charity and that has supported the building of 89 Fisher Houses, with 4 more under construction and 16 more in the plan, located on 25 military installations and 39 VA medical centers across 33 states, the United Kingdom and Germany.

Since 1991 with the first 2 homes, Fisher Houses have served over 400,000 families with over 10 million days of lodging saving those families over \$500 million. After all, there is never a charge to stay at a Fisher House.

The Southern Arizona VA Health Care System (SAVAHCS) Fisher House in Tucson has 16 private suites for families of active duty or veteran patients and reside more than 50 miles from the Tucson VA Hospital.

Being away from home with plenty on their mind, having meals ready-to-eat (and not the military MREs) is appreciated by the many guests over the years.
