Stiggy's Dogs Report



The Knights of Columbus again stepped up again to help Stiggy's Dogs serve our veterans dealing with Post Traumatic Stress.

Stiggy's Dogs has recently relocated to their new "home" operation in Hamburg. Their new headquarter facilities are far superior to their previously cramped offices and will enhance their ability to service our veterans in need. However, this new facility challenges Stiggys Dogs staff, dividing their attention between working with our veterans and necessary facility renovations/landscaping. Part their of landscaping requirements entailed clearing dense brush from their campus to make way for outdoor training activities.

Yesterday, (7-20-2017) our Sir Knights moved over 65 large "leaf bags" of yard waste from the rear of their facilities to curb-side of their parking for pick-up. Stiggy's Dogs staff was sincerely appreciative of our effort citing "...what would have been over a four hour effort was completed in less than an hour..." While a modest effort on our part, of only a few manhours and just the of gasoline to drive to Hamburg, this effort was considered HUGE in the eyes Stiggy's dogs staff, and a further validation of the Knights of Columbus support of our veterans. Catholic Uganda Beekeepers

At our July meeting we had two special guest, Father Tarcis Baugama from Uganda and SK Dave Jebb from the Saline Assembly.

I never met SK Dave before but he saw my "NO BEES NO FOOD" bump sticker on the bumper of my Jeep in the parking lot of the last exemp and put his business card under my wiper asking me contact him figuring I was a beekeeper. Dave is very kind man in his late 60s and is a commercial beekeeper in Saline. Originally from California he's only been in Michigan a few years having been a beekeeper since 1973.

Bees have been important to me before they became fashionable. I've been a beekeeper since 1999, past president of Michigan's largest beekeeping association and my honey was a consistent blue ribbon winner at the state fair (when there was a state fair).

Father Baugama is in early 50s and a very humble pious man. He heads the Brothers of St. Joseph the Worker a mission with 56 brothers. The brothers spend most of their time educating children in the Catholic religion while also hand building the schools. They get most of the funds for their projects from selling their honey and honey products. Before the assistance of SK Dave their equipment consisted of some homemade baskets and T-shirts with old recycled window screens sewed on the collars to make a hood. This is no small feat because the bees they have are the Africanized bees, the so-called "killer bees". So aggressive that when they work their hives they have to lock up their livestock in their barns otherwise the bees would kill them.

At the meeting they showed a short film showing their efforts. It's hard for me to grasp how these men go about their daily lives with such modest means. Father Baugama started a fundraising effort to raise \$10,000 for their beekeeping project. I'm proud to say Assembly #2050 donated \$1000 toward this goal. Father Baugama was moved he could hardly contain himself. He asked if he could give our Assembly a blessing. I can honestly say I've been a knight since 1991 and this was proudest moment as a knight.

The next day Dave sent me instructions how to send them the funds: He says they have a bank account at Barclays Bank of Uganda. I thought maybe some other Sir Knights would like to make a donation. I know that Judy will be making a donation:
