Highlights of Veterans Picnic on Saturday, August 11

Our Assembly held its annual Veteran's picnic at the Old National Pike District Park near New Market, MD, on Saturday, August 11. The picnic is one of the Assembly's many ways to thank veterans for their service to our country. We partnered with area food providers. A major contributor was the Frederick Wegmans market for all the meats served, assisted by Weis, Giant and Food Lion markets for side dish support, and Mac-N-

Cheese from Mission BBQ in Columbia, MD. These generous donations reflect our local stores' commitment to community support in honoring our veterans.

Desserts and beverages were generously donated by members of the assembly. The meal was prepared at the picnic by several of our Sir Knights to serve a bus load of hospitalized Veterans from the Perry Point VA Medical Center in northeastern Maryland. BBQ chicken, pulled pork, sausages, hamburgers, and hot dogs were grilled or smoked and served to nearly 30 veterans, and 50-plus other guests, including Boy Scouts from Troop 428 of St. Michael's Parish in Poplar Springs, MD., service dog handlers and many K of C family members.

The veterans were met with welcoming applause and handshakes from the Sir Knights, Scouts and family members awaiting their arrival. Beautiful weather, and the smell of the amazing food, greeted the veterans as they disembarked their bus after their long ride from Perry Point. We had set up several corn-hole games, chess sets, and other interactive games for the veterans to enjoy on their day away from their hospital routines. Sir Knight Ralph Trautwein brought his vintage 1974 yellow Charger for inspection by the vets.

A special group, the Warrior Canine Connection (WCC), a non-profit service dog organization based in Boyds, MD, was in attendance for the veterans. WCC utilizes a Mission Based Trauma Recovery model to help warriors recovering from the stress of combat reconnect with their families, communities, and life. Through this, one dog can help as many as 60 warriors heal and move forward in their lives. The dogs, with their handlers, were on hand to mingle with the veterans and entertain the men, women and children in attendance. Following their interaction with the Knights and family members, where they played games or related stories of their military careers, the veterans were able to pack up "take-home" meals for themselves and other vets back at the hospital that were unable to get away for the picnic. Upon their departure, several Sir Knights saluted the veterans as their bus pulled away.

Thanks to PFN Mike Bir for organizing the event this year, to our several cooks extraordinaire, and to the many Sir Knights and family members who donated items and assisted. Attendees at the dinner will be offered the opportunity to purchase, and then donate, the items on display, which our Assembly will subsequently deliver to the VA Medical Center. Last year, this event raised about \$250 of donated items for the vets.

With a turnout representing three Assemblies, we had 12 Color Corpsmen for the afternoon session and nine for the evening. Such a good showing of support to the family brought tears to their eyes, as many thanked us. In addition, our Color Corps supported the installation of officers for St. Michael's Council on Saturday, July 14. Thanks to Sir Knights Nau, Mahoney, Messina, Kaufman, Murray, and Venskus for supporting the above events.

At the Supreme Convention at the Baltimore Convention Center on Tuesday, August 7, our Assembly's Color Corps participated in the opening Mass and the evening banquet, as well as standing honor guard at the Adoration Chapel from 7 am until 5 pm (except during the Mass). The Mass was great in magnitude – concelebrating were 102 priests, 74 archbishops and bishops, plus ten cardinals. For the evening dinner, the flag presentations required nine national flags, each with two guards, plus 28 bearers of the historical flags (55 Color Corpsmen), with almost 11 percent from our Assembly.
