It was with pride that a motion was made at the last Business Meeting and a check was sent to her to help carry on this work of the Lord without any government funds. I just received a very touching Thank You from Susan and it will be read at the November Business Meeting next week on the 8th.

The Faithful Navigator declared the Meeting Open and all of the prescribed procedures were followed. The FN began the meeting as usual with his report and called upon the By-Laws Committee to report at that time. The major revisions of the up-dated By-Laws were then read to the assembled members. There followed a period of discussion. One of the issues was the inclusion of a maximum dollar amount that can be made in a motion for dispensing. This was included in the By-Laws to put a cap on money dispensed at a normal meeting. It does provide for the spending of amounts over this with the proper, timely notification of the entre Membership. This provision is the same as in the By-Laws of our Councils... a written statement of intent, a timely interval, and then a vote at the next following Business Meeting so that all who have a concern can attend that meeting and make their opinions heard. It is imperative that we maintain a close watch on our founds and be reasonable in how they are dispersed. Two revisions were noted for the clarification of Council 16446s name and city, and that the revision date be corrected to October 11, 2017, that being the date of the meeting. A motion was made and approved to send the By-Law revision to the Supreme Legal Department. Once they are signed by the proper Officers and sent to Supreme, and if they are approved by Supreme, they will then be posted on the Assembly Website, printed and provided to all members. If revisions are requested by Supreme they will be addressed at the next available Assembly Meeting.

Minor items can be corrected, or if a major notation is made, the By-Laws Revision committee can be re-convened or a new Committee appointed.

The Faithful Navigator then presented an *Honorary Award*, the <u>Patriotic Service</u> <u>Award</u>, to <u>Sir Knight PFN Greg Verbick</u> for his exemplary leadership of the Blue Mass. The <u>Knight of the Month</u> Award was presented to <u>PFN SK John Stefani</u> for something. An Honorary Mention was made for <u>SK Faithful Comptroller Daniel</u>

O'Connell, Jr., for assisting John with that thing. SK Faithful Purser Joe Creasey was presented an Award of Merit (along with his wife!) for many hours of work updating our books and putting them in order. An Honorable Mention was made to SK Faithful Comptroller Daniel O'Connell, Jr., for working with Joe on this as well. As you can see, the job of the Faithful Comptroller extends well beyond membership cards and dues. Having held that position for seven years before Dan took over, it is anything but easy, at lease for the first 4 or 5 years! I took over at the request of the Faithful Navigator at the time when the duly elected Comptroller took office that July, realized what the job really was, and walked out! So, as you can tell, I never was very bright! But I spent the time to get most things squared away and when Dan took over, he continued to improve upon the process and things are running very smoothly. An tribute indeed to him. But because the system has been tweaked over and over does not mean it is easy. Ask Dan the next time you see him how many hours and hours he spends every month keeping everything on an even keel. And that is in addition to his very intense job, a longtime leader in Scouting, his involvement in the Council. Oh, yeah, and his wife Annette, daughter Shannon and son Brother Brian. And his father-in-law is Former Master Ray Biliskov! His is a K of C Family with many members being Knights. Some Officers serve for a long time... but that is part of the fabric of Knights... it is what helps Council's, Assembly's, District's and State's perform to the highest standards and allows Supreme to be able to have programs, old and new, that continue to be the pride of the Church. It gives Supreme the ability to provide The Holy Father with the wherewithal to show the world what Catholics can accomplish. What is your Council number? The very first Council was No. 1, back in the 1880s. Are we up to Council 20,000 yet? I don't know right now, but we are in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Poland, the Philippians, as well as so many Military posts throughout the world, and in hundreds if not thousands of colleges and Universities thanks to the Newman Centers. So when you come to a meeting of your Council and your Assembly, as you should, as often as you can, and take part in any K of C event, stand proud! When you Sir Knights put on the Regalia, whether it is at a Confirmation or a Wake, whether leading in His Excellency the Bishop, your Parish Pastor or before the family of a departed Brother, people look at you with pride and respect. Go to any Confirmation and stand back and count the number of families that thank you, ask for a picture of you with the Confirmed. or just smile as you walk buy. Be proud and be seen! And while you are at it, LOOK for a Brother Knight and think of them as a **Sir Knight...** YOU have to ask them to take that next step. Be sure you get a Form 4 from Dan... it needs to be with you when you are at your Council meeting. You need to have one in your car!!! So that when you happen to be talking to some Catholic Gentleman and find out he is not a Knight, you can share your love of the Order with him by having the honor of asking him to join!

During his wrap-up presentation of the **Blue Mass**, **PFN Greg** thanked and congratulated all of the key members of the committee and all who took part in the event.
