### Master's Memorial Day Message

Worthy Officers and Sir Knights:

This weekend we are celebrating Memorial Day – a day when we have to take the time to thank, honor and remember all of the veterans and those still serving that have and are giving so much for our freedom. Memorial Day is a day unlike any other. Since 1868 we have come together in our communities, towns and villages, to place flowers and flags on the graves of those who have given their last full measure of devotion to our country. I ask you to remember on this Memorial Day...to honor the memory of our fallen warriors who have given everything for their country.

We are also reminded on this day that in each generation, brave men and women will always step forward to take the oath of allegiance as members of America's armed forces, willing to fight and if necessary die, for the sake of freedom. Why do they do this? They do it to provide a strong national defense --- to keep America safe and secure against those enemies who would destroy our American way of life. They do it for their fellow comrades...for those fighting by their side against all odds and for those who eventually separate from the military but proudly claim their status as veterans. # Catholics Called to Action!

Sign the petition to place HB 438, the Civil Marriage Protection Act, on the November ballot for consideration 'by the people".

On May 8, 61% of North Carolinians voted to uphold marriage and against same-sex 'marriage' becoming the 32nd state to say NO to a redefinition of marriage!

Here in Maryland, the petition drive is the first step to repeal legislation passed by the Maryland General Assembly to drastically redefine marriage in Maryland. A minimum of 56,000 valid signatures must be collected within the next few weeks in order to have the measure placed on the November ballot.

Any Maryland registered voter may sign the petition.

If you haven't signed yet, please do so at your first opportunity. Petition drives will continue for a few more weeks. If you haven't signed, and cannot locate a petition drive, contact your Grand Knight, or email kofcFAW@gmail.com
