#### Patriotic Rosary at Church of the Resurrection on June 20

In conjunction with the Fortnight for Freedom, our Assembly led a recitation of the Patriotic Rosary in the chapel at the Church of the Resurrection on Tuesday, June 20. Members of the Assembly led the recitation of the rosary. Assembly ladies Liz Coolahan and Kim Weiss, and Kim's daughter Kelly, provided the music. A total of about 25 people participated.

As part of the event, several hundred Ranger Rosaries that had been assembled by volunteers in the Ranger Rosary ministry at the Church of the Resurrection were assembled for viewing prior to being shipped to deployed members of the military. The national Ranger Rosary program, which started in 2003 at St. Mary's in Annapolis, has sent over a million rosaries to deployed members of the military since its inception.

## Color Corps Corner

Our Assembly's Color Corps has again been active during the past month. During the Patriotic Rosary at the Church of the Resurrection (article above), our Assembly's Color Corps, under the leadership of Color Corps Commander Martin Luchansky, provided a Color Guard for the event. ### Did You Know? – Military Chaplains Scholarship Fund

For the past several years, our Assembly has annually donated \$100 to the Military Chaplains Scholarship Fund. Over the past six years, the Knights of Columbus has raised over \$1.6 million in support of the tuition assistance program to recruit and ordain Catholic priests to serve our military men and women worldwide. To date, 46 men have entered the program.

We have recently been notified by the Supreme Master that the program has lost the financial support of a major annual contributor to the program. As a result, the Knights of Columbus has set a goal to raise an additional \$400,000 by June 30, 2020.

Although our Assembly has budgeted \$100 again this year for this program, we ask each Sir Knight to prayerfully consider donating \$25 directly to the program.
