Highlights of Veterans Picnic on Saturday, June 15

Our Assembly held its fourth annual Veteran's picnic, at the Old National Pike District Park near New Market on Saturday, June 15. The picnic is one of the Assembly's many ways to thank veterans for their service to our country. We partnered with area food providers and other corporate entities. The major contributor was the Frederick Wegman's supermarket, who, for the fourth year in a row, provided all the meats we prepared for the picnic lunch, as well as

condiments. This generous donation reflects Wegman's commitment to community support in honoring our veterans. Mission BBQ of Columbia, assisted by providing two big pans of their Mac-n-Cheese. Various Sir Knights and family members provided other sides and desserts.

The meal was prepared by a team of Sir Knights to serve a bus-load of hospitalized veterans from the Perry Point VA Medical Center in northeastern Maryland. The BBQ chicken, pulled pork, sausages, hamburgers and hot dogs were grilled or smoked and served to nearly 30 veterans, and 60-plus other guests, including Boy Scouts from Troop 428 of St. Michael's and Warrior Canine Connection (WCC) service dog handlers and many Knights of Columbus family members. The veterans were met by the welcoming applause and handshakes of the Sir Knights, Boy Scouts, and family members awaiting their arrival. Beautiful weather, and the smell of the grilling food, greeted the veterans as they disembarked from their bus after their long ride from Perry Point. The Sir Knights and Boy Scouts set up several bean bag toss games, chess sets, and other interactive games for the veterans to enjoy on their day away from their hospital routines.



Recap of Patriotic Rosary at Church of the Resurrection on Tuesday, June 25

In conjunction with Religious Freedom Week, our Assembly led a recitation of the Patriotic Rosary in the chapel at the Church of the Resurrection on Tuesday, June 25. Five different Sir Knights each led a decade of the rosary. A total of about 40 parishioners and Knights participated. Five members of our Assembly's Color Corps, in their last opportunity to wear the traditional uniform, formed a Color Guard to post flags before the rosary and retrieve them following the rosary.

As part of the event, several hundred Ranger Rosaries that had been assembled by volunteers in the Ranger Rosary ministry at the Church of the Resurrection were blessed by Deacon Frank O'Keefe, prior to being shipped to deployed members of the military. The national Ranger Rosary program, which started in 2003 at St. Mary's in Annapolis, has sent over a million rosaries to deployed members of the military since its inception.

utilizes a Mission Based Trauma Recovery model to help Warriors recovering from the stress of combat to reconnect with their families, communities, and life.

The Warrior canines, with their handlers, were on hand to mingle with the veterans and entertain the men, women and children in attendance. Following the veteran' interaction with the Sir Knights and family members, where they related stories of their military careers, the veterans were able to pack up "take-home" meals for themselves and other vets back at the hospital that were unable to get away for the picnic. The Assembly members also provided gift bags (donated by Bloomberg BNA) and ball caps from the Frederick Keys for each veteran. The gift bags contained numerous personal hygiene items, various snacks, sunglasses and shower shoes. Also donated to the veterans were 180 DVD movies, seven audio books, video games and 30 music CDs from a recent collection at the Church of the Resurrection for their personal entertainment back at the hospital. Upon their departure, the Sir Knights and Scouts saluted the veterans as their bus pulled away.

Thanks to PFN Mike Bir for organizing the event again this year, to our several cooks extraordinaire, and to the many Sir Knights and family members who donated items and assisted. See below for a collage of photos from the event. (Note: Due to VA regulations, we cannot display photos in which any of the vets are personally recognizable.) The next annual picnic is already being planned, hoping to accommodate even more veterans from local VA facilities.
