Students at the Halton Catholic District School Board recently created **Valentine's Day cards and heartfelt letters** for our War Veterans and to the women and men in service across the world, just in time for February 14. Each year, Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) invites Canadian schools, individuals and organizations to make Valentine's Day cards in recognition of the valiant sacrifices made by our heroes. Veterans Affairs Canada became involved with the program in 1996, and has since been receiving and distributing personalized, handcrafted Valentines to Veterans across the country.

New this year ~ Veterans were invited to St. Mary Catholic Elementary School in Oakville to visit classrooms and speak to students about their heartwarming efforts.

Arlene Iantomasi, Burlington Trustee and Vice Chair of the Board, and Knights of Columbus members, Manuel Maliksi from the Fr. Vincent Morgan Assembly, and Tom O'Brien, Charter Member of the Pope John Paul II Assembly visited several classrooms where students presented their letters and entertained guests. Approximately 200 classes across the Board created 5,000 Valentine's Day Cards, which were shipped out to the Veteran's Affairs Office in Prince Edward Island on January 28th. Some Veterans were so touched with the thoughtful cards and gestures that they personally thanked the teachers and students who participated.

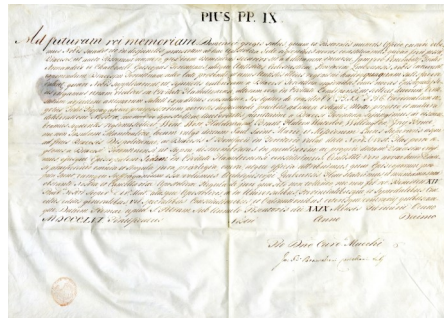
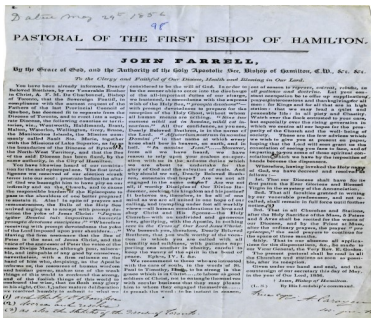

DIocese OF HAMILTON – 160 YEARS OF HISTORY

ON FEBRUARY 29, 1856, POPE PIUS IX SIGNED A PAPAL DECREE forming the Diocese of Hamilton. On the same day, he signed a decree appointing Bishop John Farrell the first Bishop of the new Diocese.

The Bishop Farrell Archives maintains documents of historical significance to the history of the Diocese of Hamilton. Included in the collection is the papal bull for the establishment of the diocese. This is the letter, issued by Pope Pius IX, validating the foundation of the diocese and outlining the physical boundaries of its jurisdiction. Another important letter in our collection is the papal bull announcing the appointment of Most Reverend John Farrell, as the first bishop of the Diocese of Hamilton. Both documents will be on display at the Mass celebrating the 160th anniversary of the diocese.



The original boundaries of the diocese are outlined as including: Wentworth, Haldimand, Brant, Halton, Waterloo, Wellington, Grey, Bruce, Manitoulin Island, the mission of Sault St. Marie, the missions of Lake Superior, and as far north as Bytown (Ottawa, Ontario) and St. Boniface (Winnipeg, Manitoba), with the See of the diocese fixed in the City of Hamilton.

1856

Bishop John Farrell was the first bishop of the Diocese of Hamilton, installed on May 24, 1856 in Hamilton's St. Mary's Church. There were estimated to be 28,000 Catholics in the region, with 9 parishes and 16 missions. There were only 4 priests and 3 Sisters of St. Joseph to help with this ministry.

1956

Bishop Joseph Ryan was the bishop, the sixth for the Diocese of Hamilton. He was installed on October 19, 1937. Bishop Ryan was a "true son" of the diocese, having been born and educated in the Diocese of Hamilton. The diocese was comprised of 86 parishes, 28 missions, and 112,000 Catholics. There were 223 active priests, 9 religious congregations of men, and 10 religious congregations of women.

Bishop Reding 1973 -1983

Bishop Paul F. Reding was the seventh Bishop for the Diocese of Hamilton. He was born in Hamilton on 14 February 1925. He attended St. Ann's Separate School and Cathedral Boys' High School in Hamilton and went on to St. Augustine's Seminary in Toronto. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1950. In 1952 he was appointed Secretary

to Bishop Ryan and in 1955 he became Chancellor for the Diocese of Hamilton. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop in 1966 and succeeded Bishop Ryan as Ordinary in 1973. Bishop Reding was noted for being a skilled administrator; he initiated several changes to the functioning of the diocese including de-centralizing administration, making greater usage of deans, and ensuring that all lay employees received fair wages and benefits. He was a committed member of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, acting as treasurer and vice-president in 1981. That same year Bishop Reding oversaw the 125th anniversary of the Diocese of Hamilton. In 1983 Bishop Reding passed due to cancer at the age of 58.

2016 - today

Bishop Douglas Crosby is the ninth bishop of the Diocese of Hamilton, having been installed on November 8, 2010. The Hamilton Diocese has grown to become the second largest English-speaking Roman Catholic Diocese in Canada. There are currently 124 parishes, 22 missions, and over 600,000 Catholics. We have 151 active priests, 13 religious congregations of men, and 13 religious congregations of women. There are 39 permanent deacons in the diocese.
