Uniform Policy Memorandum from Supreme Master SK Dennis J. Stoddard -

"Effective midnight June 30, 2019, the Order will officially retire the Fourth Degree Cape and Chapeau uniform. Continued use of said uniform is a direct violation of the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree. Members of the Fourth Degree are instructed to review Section 38 of the Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, as revised in 2017, which prescribes the official dress uniform of the Fourth Degree. We expect that all members of the Color Corps, as Catholic Gentlemen, will comply with this policy". A copy of the complete statement has been forwarded to all members of the Assembly.

Faithful Officers' Duties

Faithful Friar

The Faithful Friar is the Spiritual Advisor of the Assembly. He is expected to make a report at Assembly Meetings on religious matters. The Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Admiral and Faithful Pilot appoint a Priest annually in accordance with such rules established by the Bishop of the Diocese to serve the Assembly.

Faithful Pilot

The Faithful Pilot shall have charge of all properties of the Assembly excepts monies, accounts and record books of the officers, but including ceremonials; shall be responsible for arrangement of the Assembly Chamber and shall direct and be responsible for the activities of the Sentinels.

Assembly Event Primer

Southport Sundown Flag Lowering Ceremony

- Event Description: Participate in the Summertime Sundown Flag Lowering Ceremony in Downtown Southport.
- Duration: 30-45 minutes (ceremony takes about 5 minutes)
- Assembly Role: Team of four to six Knights lowering the flag while "playing" Taps on a bugle. Flag is then folded and marched to Southport Police Station for storage.
- Required Attire: Assembly shirt, slacks and ball cap

Southport Independence Day Flag Raising Ceremony

- Event Description: Raising of U.S. Flag at Intersection of Howe and Moore Streets before the start of North Carolina's Official 4th of July Parade.
- Duration: Two hours. WARNING BE ADVISED DO TO TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN SOUTHPORT YOU SHOULD GIVE PLENTY OF TRAVEL TIME TO ARRIVE EARLY FOR PARADE START.
- Assembly Role: Faithful Navigator and Grand Knight escorted by members of the Assembly carry U.S. Flag to intersection and raise it on flagpole.
- Required Attire: Khaki trousers and Assembly shirt
