Picnic for Veterans Scheduled for Saturday, June 15

Our fourth annual Picnic for Veterans has been scheduled for 11:00 am (note new earlier start time) on Saturday, June 15, at Old National Pike Park (12406 Old National Pike, Mt. Airy, MD 21771). Past Faithful Navigator Mike Bir has agreed to chair the picnic again this year, and has reserved the pavilion. We are expecting 10-15 veterans (most in wheelchairs) from the Loch Raven VA Center and about 25 veterans from the Perry Point VA Center (mostly mobile) to attend.

With the expected total attendance (perhaps 100, including the veterans, VA attendants assisting them, and volunteers), we have reached out to local businesses for donations. Wegman's in Frederick is donating a variety of items, including chicken thighs, chicken wings, chicken breasts, Italian sausage, pork, ground beef, beef franks, cheese slices, hamburger and hot dog rolls, ketchup, mustard, relish and mayonnaise. Mission BBQ in Columbia is donating a large pan of macaroni and cheese, and Giant Food and Food Lion have provided gift cards to purchase additional food items.

We are seeking additional food and drink donations from members of our Assembly and their families. VA rules state that we can only provide salads and desserts that are commercially prepared. We can provide fresh fruits and vegetables. We are also asking for donations of items to be put in gift bags for the vets attending, including socks, word search puzzles, deodorant, ball caps, individually wrapped snacks, lip balm, lotion, slippers, water shoes, and blankets. It would be great if those could be delivered at the Assembly meeting at St. Peter's on Thursday, May 23.

Secret Service Facility Tour on Friday, May 31

Our Assembly's Faithful Captain (FC) Steve Mason, also a member Resurrection Council 11341, has arranged for Assembly 2595 and Council 11341 members to receive a tour of the United States Secret Service's Training facility in Laurel on Friday, May 31, at 10:00 am. FC Steve has provided all of the information that follows. The tour will last approximately four hours. This opportunity came about because FC Steve has taken other groups to this tour and was able to make contact with an old friend who has helped him to set up the tour. FC Steve is a retired Secret Service Agent who served for 23 years. The Secret Service is a federal law enforcement agency under the Department of Homeland Security that is charged with conducting criminal investigations and protecting the nation's current and past leaders. As one of the oldest and best law enforcement agencies, it was formed on July 5, 1865, when two-thirds of all paper currency in the United States was counterfeit.

In order to participate in the tour, FC Steve needs to have those attending cleared for admittance to the facility. To do this, he needs to provide a list of attendees with their full name, date of birth, and Social Security Number. He needs that data no later than May 24. The tour is limited to 40 persons. So please get your information to FC Steve by the date requested.

There is likely to be a car pool from the Church of the Resurrection leaving no later than 8:30 am on the tour date. For anyone who cannot meet at the church and wants to go directly, the address is the James J. Rawley Training Center, 9200 Powder Mill Road. Laurel, MD. Please arrive no later than 9:45 am.

FC Steve is certain that you will enjoy this tour, which will give you an interesting view of what agents go through to prepare to be investigative/protection agents for the Secret Service. You will get an up-close look at the President's vehicle. You will be given an actual ride in a vehicle that agents use to train on driving the President. You will be shown the weapons the Service uses, and a demonstration of their bomb detection canine partners, along with other interesting training programs such as the CAT, or Counter Assault Teams.
