### FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR'S REPORT



November is the month we remember those who have gone before us and also the members of the Canadian Armed Forces who served in the World Wars, Korea, Bosnia, Afghanistan and the many peace keeping missions that continue today. Because I had the opportunity to serve

for 5 years, I have used a picture of myself, during my service in RCAF a long time ago, to remind of us of the service many give to our country. The picture was taken in either late 1960 or early 1961 when I was stationed in Churchill, Manitoba during the Cold War period. From there we supplied our artic bases in Resolute Bay and Alert in Greenland. In the final stages of the 2<sup>nd</sup> world war my father was killed in action in 1945 in Holland, my cousin lost in life as well and my uncle served in the RCAF. In the 1<sup>st</sup> world war my grandfather served with the British Army. My younger brother also was a member of the RCAF, and his son served with the Canadian Army and saw extensive duty in the Bosnian conflict.

This year, November 11<sup>th</sup> falls on a Monday, which means we will be participating in the Bronte Parade on Sunday November 10<sup>th</sup> and the Oakville parade on Monday November 11<sup>th</sup>. Participation is not limited to those in the new uniform, you can parade with the Knights wearing your tuxedo and social baldric or a dark suit with the social baldric. Please consider joining the honour guard and participating in either the Bronte
