Preferably, please pick a sunny day, with a gentle breeze, <u>between now and Sunday, November 8</u>.

We will create a gallery of these photos on the Assembly web site, and publish a link to that gallery on Veterans Day, November 11. We will also include selected photos in a collage in the November Assembly newsletter.

Christmas Cards for Deployed Service Members

Every year, people all over the world celebrate the spirit of the season with a Christmas tradition: sending Christmas cards to friends and family alike. Whether sending them to folks back home, or distributing them among neighbors, people find joy in the simple act of sending season's greetings to those they love. But this year, consider spreading cheer overseas by sending Christmas cards to soldiers stationed away from home. What better way to show our heroes abroad how much we appreciate their work and sacrifice than by sending them warm thoughts and affection in the form of a Christmas card this holiday season? Our Assembly will be collecting your virtual Christmas cards to send to our Military troops.

When writing your letter or card, it is important to keep your messaging positive. Be sure to thank them for their service and remind them that it does not go unnoticed or unappreciated. Feel free to remind them that they are in your prayers. For letter content, talk about yourself: tell them about things you like, what you do, or about where you live. How to Submit an Online Prayer Request

We have had a number of prayer requests mentioned at recent Assembly meetings. But you do not have to wait to participate in an Assembly meeting. Our Assembly web site provides a way to submit a prayer request that will be available online for 30 days for all to review. To submit a prayer request, go to our Assembly web site at <u>http://kofcAssembly2595.org</u>. Then select PRAYER REQUESTS at the left. This will take you to a new page. Once there, click on SUBMIT YOUR REQUEST. You will then be asked to enter your K od C member number and a pass code (which is your birthday), after which you can enter your prayer request. (Note: It may take a while for new Sir Knights to have their membership information reflected in the web site, which may affect your ability to submit prayer requests.)
