Highlights of the Veterans Picnic on September 26

Our Assembly held its fifth Veterans Picnic at the Old National Pike District Park in New Market, Maryland on Sunday, September 26. These picnics are one of the patriotic activities that the Assembly sponsors to honor our active and retired military veterans to thank them for their service and many sacrifices to the country. This picnic is especially meaningful as it directly affects those veterans that are confined to VA hospitals and nursing homes in the Baltimore area. This year, the patients were from Perry Point VA Medical Center in Northeastern Maryland.

As has been the custom, our Assembly has a team of BBQ grillers and smokers who prepare a great quantity of smoked pulled pork and grilled chicken, sausages, hamburgers and hot dogs along with sides, to serve the 20+ veterans and their assistants from the hospital that arrived by bus around noon at the park pavilion. Our Assembly is most grateful to our corporate partner, Wegmans of Frederick, for their continued support of this program through their donation of all the meat, rolls and condiments for the picnic. Mission BBQ of Frederick and Columbia also supplied sides of baked beans and Macn-Cheese to round out the menu.

In addition to Sir Knights of our Assembly and their families, Boy Scouts from Troop 428 of St. Michael's, Poplar Springs, also participated. A featured group at the picnic, as entertainment and instruction for the veterans, was the Warrior Canine Connection service dogs, and their handlers who gave presentations about the utility of these canines as emotional support animals for many veterans with different traumatic stress-related issues, to help them reconnect with their families, communities and their lives after seeing combat duty.

The bus of veterans was welcomed by the Knights, Scouts and family members as it pulled up to the pavilion. As they disembarked the bus, to the applause and accolades of the crowd, they quickly headed to the tables for a delicious lunch, preceded by a National Anthem and pledge of Allegiance and grace.
