**Mother's Day** is a celebration honoring the Mother of the family, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds, and the influence of mothers in society. It is celebrated on various days in many parts of the world, most commonly in the months of March or May.



**Armed Forces Day** is celebrated on the third Saturday in May. It falls near the end of **Armed Forces Week**, which begins on the second Saturday of May and ends on the third Sunday of May (the fourth if the month begins on a Sunday, as in 2016). First observed on 20 May 1950, the day was created on 31 August 1949, to honor Americans serving in the five U.S. military branches – the <u>U.S. Army</u>, <u>U.S. Navy</u>,

<u>U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Air Force</u> and <u>U.S. Coast Guard</u> – following the consolidation of the military services in the <u>U.S. Department of Defense</u>. It was intended to replace the separate Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard Days, but the separate days are still observed, especially within the respective services.



Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States for remembering the people who died while serving in the country's armed forces. The holiday, which is currently observed every year on the last Monday of May, was held on May 30 from 1868-1971. It marks the start of the unofficial summer vacation season, while Labor Day marks its end.

### Medal of Honor Presented TO

#### BRUCE, DANIEL D.

- Rank and Organization: Private First Class, U.S. Marine Corps, Headquarters and Service Company, 3d Battalion, 5th Marines, 1st Marine Division
- Place and Date: Fire Support Base Tomahawk, Quang Nam Province, Republic of Vietnam, 1 March 1969

**Citation:** For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a mortar man with Headquarters and Service Company 3d Battalion, against the enemy. Early in the morning Pfc. Bruce was on watch in his night defensive position at fire support base tomahawk when he heard movements ahead of him. An enemy explosive charge was thrown toward his position and he reacted instantly, catching the device and shouting to alert his companions. Realizing the danger to the adjacent position with its 2 occupants, Pfc. Bruce held the device to his body and attempted to carry it from the vicinity of the entrenched marines. As he moved away, the charge detonated and he absorbed the full force of the explosion. Pfc. Bruce's indomitable courage, inspiring valor and selfless devotion to duty saved the lives of 3 of his fellow marines and upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country.



# Persecution of Christians A series of articles

A Christian persecution watchdog has released statistics suggesting a Christian is martyred for their faith every five minutes. <u>Christian Freedom Inter-</u><u>national (CFI)</u> has found that more than 200 million followers are facing persecution in 105 countries. This makes Christianity the most persecuted religion in the world.

The report has found that more Christians have been martyred in the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries than during the previous 19 combined. Opens Doors has released a <u>global map</u> showing the distribution of Christian persecution around the world.

North Korea is at the top of the list, followed by Somalia and Iraq. Most of the 50 countries listed are either in the Middle East or Africa. As part of this year's International Day of Prayer, 8 November, CFI are encouraging Christians to join them in praying for those who are persecuted.

"[Persecuted believers] are your Christian family throughout the world," said Jim Jacobson, president of CFI. "Pray for their safety; that they would be emboldened to continue sharing the Gospel even in the face of persecution; that their persecutors would also come to know Christ as they observe the courageous witness of these believers." Also included in the top 10 are Afghanistan, Sudan, Iran, Pakistan and Eritrea. "Wherever there is growing <u>Islamic radicalism</u>, there is growing persecution of Christians," CFI said. "Even where moderate Islamic states offer peace — and that is rare — they almost never have freedom to practice their faith and are often marked for death."

### Navigator's Note for 2017:

Remember as Knights, we are <u>"The Caregivers of the People"</u> not only when Father McGivney started the Knights of Columbus, but in part, it was the slogan of our early **Pope's 'Christian Knights'** that fought in the Crusades, <u>"Protect the People, it is God's Will"</u>.
