MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT



Brother Knights,

I have two unrelated topics this month.

<u>Pro-life</u>

There are many causes that the Knights of Columbus promote. One that I feel very strongly about is the Pro-Life movement. Ever since my mom took me to a March for Life in the mid-70s, I have been involved off and on (more off than I would like to admit). I plan to go to the march this year again, as it is a beautiful testament to God's work, through us, to protect innocent lives. I anticipate that the Knights will have a strong presence as always, but more can be done. I hope to see you there.

At 8:00 am on the third Sunday of every month, members of our council pray in front of Planned Parenthood on Eugie, just east of 59th Avenue. There are usually 4-5 people in the group. If everyone in our council joined in the prayer one month a year, there would be 15-20 people praying there every month. If you can't make it, pray for an end to abortion at home.

If you happen to be pro-choice for whatever reason, please prayerfully read up on the Catholic Church's teachings on abortion. There is a lot of noise out there concerning this issue, but when you get down to the facts, there is no good argument. Last month, we passed out a "Why We Are Pro-Life" booklet to parishioners. If you have one, please read it. Better yet, take it to the Adoration Chapel and read it there. If you do not have a copy, let me know and I will get you one. One tactic of the pro-abortion argument is that we should not push our religion on them, but this book makes a strong, non-religious argument that life is one of the most basic rights that we have as humans.

The parable of the seeds and the 4 soils.

In both Luke 8, and Matthew 13, Jesus tells "The Parable of the Sower." In the passage, Jesus describes planting seeds into four types of soil; the hard path, rocky, thorny, and good soil. Other than the hard path, every type of soil was capable of producing a plant to some extent. Only the good soil produced a harvestable fruit. Recognizing that the seeds in this parable as the teachings of Jesus, and the soils as those individuals who he was trying to relate his message too, we might question ourselves as to what type of "soil" we are.

This particular parable fits into our lives in many circumstances that we may not readily want to accept. As an example, being a member of the Knights of Columbus, we may often feel overwhelmed with requests or opportunities (the seeds?) and then sit back and make a choice as to what action we are going to take (the soil). How productive are we going to be as a Knight?

Could this be the watershed moment of an event that initiates a turning point in our support at the council level? There certainly are plenty of instances where all of us have had to look at those opportunities and wonder if we "fit in." Becoming a Knight and/or renewing our membership as a Knight assures us that we do "fit in." None of us have the time available to participate in all the projects our council conducts. Many members are actively involved in other church ministries that are accommodating to their lives based on the ages of their children. There are work schedules, personal care needs of family members, etcetera, that dictate how much discretionary time we can allot to support other activities. Difficulties arise, no one can hold us accountable at any time when personal conflicts become a priority in our lives. After managing those personal needs, we are hopeful to have your continued membership and support in our council when time permits. Membership and participation are key to our success, and we look forward to everyone renewing their membership with us.

Bingo Snack Bar


