

Greetings, Brother Sir Knights! (From the other side of the "pond" - vacationing with family!)

Vacations are great times, but as my mom and dad always used to say "you know you've had a great vacation when you're happy to be going home!" Mind you we kids always used to say that they were happy to get us back to school and out of their hair again! The Scriptures never tell us of Jesus going on vacation, but given that he had so much to teach us, perhaps it was better that he didn't. But we do know that he often "went off alone to pray". For me there are always two parts to a vacation, or just going off somewhere - the change of scenery, and the change of routine. A change of scenery is always fun to see different places, eat different foods, meet new people, and experience different customs. Even staying in a hotel, or camping out, is sufficient change to be invigorating. But we all know that getting back home and the many worldly comforts we have there is also a delight. But for me, at least, it is the change of routine that is more invigorating. At home I have schedules to follow - morning Mass at set times, meeting schedules for spiritual direction of parishioners (and others), and all the other demands of daily life. On vacation, I just go with the flow of whatever my hosts (usually other priests) have arranged - mass is at whatever time it is at in his parish, meals whenever, etc. etc. giving me time to pray the Divine Office, Rosary, and other prayers more fully (and sometimes with less rush!) A vacation without any structure can quickly become just a time of idleness, and we all know what the devil likes to do with idle hands! So, as you head for vacation this year, relish the changes and the challenges it will bring, unite yourself with Jesus, and his Mother, as you do with your family, give time to them, and you'll find time also for yourself, for renewal, refreshment, and an eager return eventually to the work of serving one another in Jesus' name.
