A Shepherd's Message (Message from the Cardinal)

The Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of Initiation; it completes Baptismal Grace, and leads to the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Baptism and Confirmation are received once! The Eucharist is the Sacrament of our nurture in Faith and is continuously received.

Fed on the Body and Blood of Christ, the Christian disciple goes forth to live Baptism and the grace of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation — the gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord. In the Sacrament of Confirmation each baptized person is more perfectly bound to the Church, is enriched and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, anointed to be a public witness of Christ, and obliged to spread and defend the faith in word and deed. The original sign of the laying on of hands after baptism received the addition of the sign of anointing with chrism oil very early in Christian history. In a certain way the Sacrament of Confirmation perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church.

In the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, Confirmation is celebrated for our young people in their teenage years, usually 10th and 11th grade of high school. Last year close to 10,000 young people were confirmed. I along with Bishop Sheltz and a few other bishops are the normal celebrants for Confirmation of our youth.

In addition, those adults and children of catechetical age who enter the Church through the Rite of Christian Initiation are confirmed at the time of either their Baptism, or, if they have entered the Church from other Christian denominations, during their Profession of Faith to the Catholic Church. Their Confirmations are celebrated by the priests of the parish; it is the right of pastors to do so by Canon Law itself. Last year some 2,300 persons entered the Church and were confirmed in this group.

Finally, there are a number of adults who, though baptized as infants and even having received their First Communion and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, have never been confirmed. Since the year 2000, this Archdiocese began preparing these adults at the parish level leading up to their celebration of Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday. Bishop Sheltz and I always celebrate these Confirmations. Last year some 1,400 adults were confirmed at Pentecost. Starting this year, the Archdiocese extended this celebration to the Sunday of the Epiphany.

I consider the celebration of Confirmation (and the process of formation that leads to it) one of the more significant acts of evangelization that I do. I always encourage those confirmed to remember that they are witnesses: they are, to use a metaphor, "signed, sealed and delivered" just like a letter, a letter of the human heart now turned outward in witness to Jesus through the extraordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit that are given to all the confirmed. Once confirmed, you are "on notice" from the Lord that you are one of His interpreters. Your life translates the Gospel and the face of Jesus to others. It is a great dignity and joy, and a heavy challenge!

I want to extend my gratitude to our pastors and priests, our deacons and religious, our religious educators in schools and parishes, and above all our Catechists, for the essential, beautiful and sometimes trying work done in order to form our children, youth, young and old adults for the Sacrament of Confirmation each year. It is a great labor of evangelization, a formation that makes every catechist beg the Lord and His Mother to allow them to be transparent witnesses of the good news themselves, so that others will pick up the flame of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

College Scholarship Opportunity:

The Knights of Columbus Council #8960 is offering college scholarships this year from a pool of \$4500. The council's scholarship committee will review all applications, conduct interviews, and host the written essay submitted with the scholarship application. The committee will determine how many scholarships to award and the amount of each award based on the number of qualified applicants. The minimum award will be \$500. Chris Lessmann will have applications at the next council meeting or you may contact him at chris.lessmann@yahoo.com. Applications are due April 5, 2017.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. Must be a child or grandchild of a Brother Knight of Council #8960 in good standing (i.e. current on membership dues or dues exempt).
- 2. Must be a practicing Catholic who has received the sacrament of Confirmation.
- 3. Must be graduating from high school in Spring 2017 (or earlier).
- 4. Must be graduating with a grade point average of 2.5/4.0 or above.
- 5. Must be attending a college or university as a full-time freshman in the fall of 2017. Those selected for scholarships will need to show proof of enrollment prior to receiving payment.
