### The Six Pre-Whats?

One of the blessings of moving to the USA from Ireland is that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is now a much more real part of my ministry than at home. I was delighted to hear at a recent meeting of priests in the South Central Area of the Baltimore Archdiocese that attendance at the sacrament was up over Christmas and that people were indeed keen to attend. That is the context, a positive one, for what I want to wonder about.

How is it that so few Catholics can give you an answer, if you persist in asking, what their minimum commitment to the Sacrament of Reconciliation should be? How puzzled many people are when I mention the answer to the question can be found in 'precepts of the Catholic Church'. People glaze over at the mention of this rather unfortunate legal sounding term. I wonder do they think it is part of the revival of archaic words that the new translation of the Sacramentary has initiated among us.

But no – the six 'rules' exist and are useful. They can be found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 2041 and following). The third of these states: 'You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season'. A member of the church who does not do this is breaking with the central belief of our faith in the resurrection of Jesus and that we have, through the gift of the Eucharist, the food to sustain us to our journey to sharing in the glory inaugurated by Christ's resurrection.

Related to the precept on Holy Communion is the second precept which states: 'You shall confess your sins at least once a year'. The Sacrament of Reconciliation 'continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness'. I think this is a wonderfully helpful position to take. The result is the church challenges

everyone, yes everyone, to have the humility to reflect on their lives and confess their sins within clear and set periods of time. We are being asked to recognize that often even if we are listening to our conscience we must make the necessary step of putting words on our failings and more importantly celebrating the forgiveness our faith in God offers us.

It is a good idea to periodically review whom you have listed as the beneficiaries of your life insurance policies and annuities. The primary beneficiary(ies) are first to receive the policies' death benefit. The contingent beneficiary(ies) receive the death benefit only if all primary beneficiaries are also deceased.

Young couples with young children might have listed each other as primary beneficiaries and a parent or sibling as contingent. That is...their childrens' grandparent, aunt or uncle. Years later, with grown children, the contingent might be more appropriately listed as "all children equally".

It is a very simple process to change the beneficiaries of your Knights of Columbus insurance policies. You just need to have your Council Benefits Advisor (that would be me) witness your signature on a Change of Beneficiary form. At the same time, it is also a good idea for us to review the cash value that has accumulated in your KofC whole life policies and annuities. That accumulation is quite often substantial! If you do not have any KofC policies or annuities with beneficiaries and cash value to

review, then you and your loved ones are missing a critical benefit of membership. Here again we should arrange to meet. So please call me or email me using the information listed above.

## SUPREME INFORMATION

### Survey Finds Unity among Americans on Abortion Restrictions

*Nearly 8 in 10 advocate significant restrictions on abortion*

As the United States marks the 39th anniversary of the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision, a new survey shows that the vast majority of Americans support significant abortion restrictions.

The Knights of Columbus-Marist Poll found that 79 percent of Americans say that they

would not allow abortion after the first three months of pregnancy. 51 percent would only allow abortion – at most – in cases of rape, incest, or to save the life of the mother – or would not allow it at all. The numbers have held up over time as well and are almost unchanged from two years ago.

“Almost four decades after the Supreme Court’s decisions in *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*, which resulted in the almost totally unrestricted abortion regime of today, these decisions continue to be out of step with the vast majority of Americans,” said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. “Far from being settled law, the inadequacy of the Court’s reasoning on abortion in *Roe* and *Doe* is readily apparent to most Americans. Once a survey moves beyond the labels of pro-life and pro-choice, we see a fundamental unity among Americans in favor of significant abortion restrictions.”

In addition, the survey found that Americans (84 percent) believe that laws can protect both the life of the unborn and health and well-being of women. That number was consistent with – and slightly higher than – findings two years ago when the number who said both could be protected was 81 percent.

The questions on abortion were part of a broader survey, which will be released in February.

This report details the findings from a telephone survey of 1,053 adults residing in the continental United States. Data were collected from December 15, 2011 through December 27, 2011 using an online, probability-based panel from Knowledge Networks, Inc. Reports for adults have a margin of error within +/- 3 percentage points.

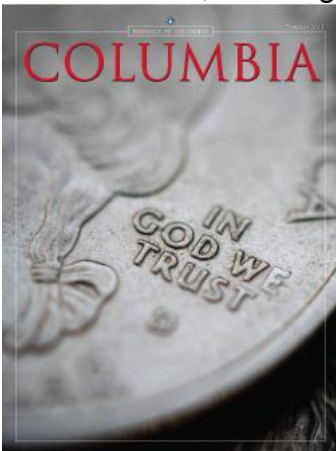
