Chaplain's Corner

Dear Brother Knights,

Years ago, I was travelling by train from my hometown to a town where my Abbey is in India. I was a frater then. It was a long train journey that took two full days! In and around the railway stations in India, you come across different types of people. One such group is trans-genders. Society mostly hated them, as they would extort money from the passengers. Since they approach you in a group, they often force you to give them money; a kind of extortion you often see in India. As a frater you do not have much money with you.

In my journey, at a particular time, two of them came to the coach I was in. They went around asking for money from all the passengers in the coach as I expected. But I noticed one of them was not that forceful. I also noticed she was limping! Since she was not forcefully asking for money, I ignored her and looked away. I did not give her any money. She clearly had need. Later, as I looked through my window, I saw the same person sitting on a bench examining a deep wound on her leg. From her face, I could feel she was hurting. The bandage was dirty and reddish in color. She unwound it, examined her wound and covered the sore with the same rag! I could read the sadness on her face. She was helpless! As the train moved out of that station, she too moved away from my sight. I was deeply saddened to see that sight! Her deplorable plight! I felt bad for not offering her any money. Our society has several misconceptions about trans-genders. Society tells you that they are bad. I grew up hearing such misconceptions therefore; I too held such an idea about them. I had every excuse to deny that person even one dollar! But I did not search for even one excuse to give her that money. Now I realize that the society was cruel to treat them that way. That was not the way to treat them. That was not Jesus' way!

I shared this incident to explain, how people suffer, often alone, without anyone to help them! We see around us in our society, in our cities and in our world who suffer untold miseries. They need our help. They need our support to rebuild their lives. We have responsibilities towards them. It may be easy for us to ignore them. But God wants us to come to their aid; they are a person in need. That's what Jesus has taught us especially through the parable of Good Samaritan. We are often oblivious to the sufferings of others because of our selfishness. Jesus teaches us to be other-centered and not to be self-centered. This is the basic principle of Knights of Columbus, too. And we the members try to put it into practice by charitable work we do in the society. In this regards, my fellow Knights, you guys are doing a commendable job! What you do in our society is noble. I want to thank you for what you do. Let us continue to challenge ourselves and others to commit to caring for others in every way possible. Let us reach out to the needy more and more. Let us not marginalize any one on the basis of their color, race, creed, status, gender or class. Rather, let us come to the aid of those denied their basic rights. God bless!
