#### Father Michael McGivney's Cause for Canonization Advances

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — The cause for sainthood for Father Michael McGivney, a parish priest in Connecticut who founded the Knights of Columbus, has taken another official step forward.

At the fraternal organization's 131st Supreme Convention in San Antonio earlier this month, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson reported "there is good news concerning Father McGivney's cause. A possible miracle attributed to his intercession is now under investigation in Rome."

If the miracle is approved, Father McGivney would be beatified and receive the title of "Blessed."

"If he were beatified now, he would be the first United States-born parish priest to be beatified," noted Brian Caulfield, the vice postulator for Father McGivney's cause for canonization.

Explaining the process for this new step, Caulfield said, "We were investigating at the diocesan level, and that investigation has been completed. All the documentation was delivered to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints at the Vatican in March."

He noted that there were no initial objections to the documentation, and the Vatican congregation is moving forward with its role. "It is now in the early stages of investigation there," Caulfield said.

"The Vatican is now gathering a medical commission to study the possible miracle and determine if it is beyond medical explanation."

If the commission approves, "then it goes to a theological commission, which will decide whether to send a recommendation to the Holy Father for approval," Caulfield said. "Then this would be the miracle for the declaration for the beatification."

At the Vatican, the steps for Father McGivney's cause are being handled by the postulator, Andrea Ambrosi. He works closely with the Congregation for the Causes of Saints and has completed many causes brought from more than 40 countries.

Along with serving as postulator for Father McGivney's cause, Ambrosi is postulator for several more candidates' causes, including Blessed Pope John XXIII, Blessed John Henry Newman, Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen and Fathers Augustus Tolton, Emil Kapaun and Patrick Peyton, each designated a "Servant of God."

In December 2011, Caulfield was appointed vice postulator to succeed Dominican Father Gabriel O'Donnell, the initial vice postulator when Father McGivney's cause officially opened in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Conn., in 1997. Father O'Donnell, now an administrator at the Dominican House of Studies in Washington, remains director of the Father McGivney Guild, the official source of information on his life and cause for canonization.

The school was named after First Lieutenant Baldomero Lopez. He was born August 23, 1925 in Tampa, Florida and attended Hillsborough High School.

Baldomero Lopez was a First Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps during the Korean War. He was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for smothering a hand grenade with his own body during the Inchon Landing, on September 15, 1950.

In addition to the Medal of Honor, 1st Lt Lopez's decorations include the Purple Heart Medal, Presidential Unit Citation with one bronze star, China Service Medal, and Korean Service Medal with two bronze stars.

Shortly after the outbreak of the Korean War, he volunteered for duty as an infantry officer in Korea. He was promoted to the rank of first lieutenant on June 16, 1950.

First Lieutenant Baldomero Lopez. Lopez was forever immortalized in a picture of him leading his men over the seawall at Inchon.

The photo was taken during the Assault on Red Beach, 5th Marines, September 15, 1950.

A few minutes after it was taken, Lieutenant Lopez sacrificed his life, smothering a live hand grenade with his own body to protect his men.

It was an act of bravery that earned him the Nation's top military decoration, the Medal of Honor

Candidates' registration begins at 9:00AM with the exemplification beginning at 11:00AM.

All candidates Form 4's and Candidates, Sir Knights, Spouse and Guest order form MUST be submitted to the Master no later than August 5, 2015. See Form 4 sample and insure all necessary information is completed.

Candidates and Sir Knights dress for the Exemplification is to be: black tuxedo, plain white pleated tuxedo shirt, black bow tie, black shoes, and black cummerbund. Members of the Armed Forces may wear their full military dress uniform in place of the tuxedo.

Dress for the Banquet will be, Formal wear for Sir Knights and the Ladies, suitable dress for the occasion.

Emblem of the Patriotic Degree

#### Fourth Degree Emblem

The triad emblem of the Fourth Degree features the dove, the cross and the globe. The dove, classic symbol of the Holy Spirit and peace, is shown hovering over the orb of the Earth (globe). Both are mounted on a variation of the Crusader's cross, which was found on the tunics and capes of the Crusading knights who battled to regain the Holy Land from the pagans.

Spiritually, the sacred symbols on the emblem typify the union of the Three Divine Persons in one Godhead, the most Blessed Trinity.

The Globe – God the Father, Creator of the Universe.

The Cross – God the Son, Redeemer of Mankind.

The Dove – God the Holy Spirit, Sanctifier of Humanity.

The colors of the symbols are:

A blue globe with the land of the Western Hemisphere in white.

A red cross with gold borders and gold knobs at the end of the points forming the ends of the arms of the cross, also known as the Isabella cross.

A white dove.

Red, white and blue are the colors of the flag of the country in which the Knights originated. They are used to stress patriotism, the basic principle of the Fourth Degree.



#### Answering the Call to Service



The Knights of Columbus has grown to new heights in its charitable giving and volunteer hours during 2014, once again answering Pope Francis' call to reach out to those in need, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson told the state deputies and state deputy-elects in his address at the 2015 Organizational Meeting of State Deputies in New Haven.

The Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record last year for charitable donations and service hours with \$173,550,680 in donations and more than 71.5 million hours of service. The number of service hours contributed by members rose in 2014 by more than a million hours over the 2013 total, with each member donating nearly a full workweek on average.

According to the K of C's Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2014, donations grew by more than \$3.4 million over 2013, achieving an increase in giving for the 15th consecutive year.

"These numbers show that the Knights of Columbus has the courage to make a witness to charity and to practice fraternal outreach to those in need," Supreme Knight Anderson said.

Among its major donations in 2014, the Knights of Columbus made a gift of \$1.4 million in support of athletes who will take part in this summer's Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles. The funds will cover the cost of transportation, housing and meals for the athletes as they travel to the games, stay there during the competition, and return home. Supreme Knight Anderson also asked state jurisdictions to step up their already strong support for Special Olympics athletes.

Another unique initiative in 2014 was the Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund, which has contributed \$2.6 million for humanitarian assistance to those suffering persecution and dislocation in Iraq and the surrounding region.

"It has shocked the conscience of the world that people are systematically being purged from the region where their families have lived for millennia — simply for their faith," said Mr. Anderson at the program's inception in August. "It is imperative that we stand in solidarity with them."

Gifts by the Knights of \$200,000 each were also made to the Byzantine and Latin Rite Catholic communities of war-torn Ukraine for humanitarian relief, supporting projects that feed and aid homeless children and refugees living on the streets of the capital city of Kiev.

The Knights continued to support their local communities in 2014 through such programs as the Black Friday Coats for Kids event, Food for Families and blood drives. Knights also gave assistance to such organizations as Habitat for Humanity and the American Wheelchair Mission.

During the past decade the Knights of Columbus has donated nearly \$1.55 billion to charity and 691 million hours of volunteer service in support of charitable initiatives.
