Lecturer's Corner

Ephesians 4:1-6

I, then, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, 3 striving to preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace: 4 one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6 one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Chapter 4 of Ephesians is a transition point - from theological explanation (1:1-3:21) to practical application (4:1-6), from explaining how God loves us to applying how we are to respond to God's love. Let's break these six verses down.

- 1 I, then, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received
- On a simple yet meaningful level, this could sort of be our "Mission Statement" as Christians.
- 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love,
- Here we see three qualities essential to our discipleship:
 - a. <u>Humility</u> This is literally "Be lowly-minded". It <u>does not</u> mean that we should think less of ourselves; it means to think of ourselves less when we are around others. Like the Blessed Virgin Mary, it is about putting others first.
 - b. <u>Gentleness</u> Gentleness/meekness <u>does not mean</u> passive weakness it means <u>active strength under control</u> for a worthy purpose. Jesus sets an example for us. Jesus was infinitely powerful, and he could have (rightfully) used his power to intimidate others into bowing to him. But he never did this. He always used his power gently teaching and loving others and inviting them to voluntarily follow him (Matt.11:28-30). And his power is with us so that we can relate to others in this same way and for this same purpose.
 - c. <u>Patience</u> the word used in this passage means "long-suffering" and is linked to the phrase, "make allowance for each other's faults."

Verse 2 tells us HOW we can and should relate to one another. If we relate to one another in this fashion and those who are far from God may become attracted to Him through the example we set. With these next verses we learn WHY.

- 3 striving to preserve the **unity of the Spirit** through the **bond of peace**:
- If we live the calling in verse 2, it will help us along the way to show unity through peace that can then lead us to living the 7 'One's that come next:
- $\frac{4}{3}$ one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call;
- $\frac{5}{2}$ one Lord, one faith, one baptism;
- $\frac{6}{2}$ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.
- "One body" we actually are Christ's "body," the visible expression of Jesus to the watching world, so we should demonstrate his love through quality community.
- "One Spirit" we are each indwelt by God's Spirit, so we already have the greatest spiritual reality in common.
- "One hope" we will spend eternity together, so we might as well learn how to get along with and enjoy one another now!
- "One Lord" we have all decided to follow the same Leader in every aspect of our lives, so we can expect that he will lead us in a unified way.
- "One faith" we all have the same body of truth (the gospel), so we can agree on what is true and right.
- "One baptism" we all publicly confessed our allegiance to the same Jesus, so we should honor him in this way.
- "One God and Father" we are all children of the same heavenly Father and are, therefore, brothers and sisters of the same family.

This is our challenge: to *live in a manner worthy of the call* we have received. With great eagerness let us choose to live this challenge!

Divine Mercy Moment

Continuing on Humility, our Lord Jesus in St. Faustina's Diary 427 said, "True greatness of the soul is in loving God and in humility." In Diary 514, St. Faustina in devotion and humility to our Lord said "Jesus, make my heart like unto Yours, or rather transform it into Your own Heart that I may sense the needs of other hearts, especially those who are sad and suffering. May the rays of mercy rest in my heart." Maybe it could be prayed in this manner also, "Lord grant me the grace to be a living reflection of your mercy to others." We must remember we are depended on God's grace and it is all through His grace that we receive and share His Mercy.

137th SUPREME CONVENTION

➤ Highlights

- 1) Three beautiful Masses on Tues (opening), Wed (celebrated by a Native American Priest) and third one celebrated by Archbishop Lori.
- 2) Hierarchy and Fourth Degree presence at all masses.
- 3) States Dinner Tuesday night. KofC road choir sang the songs from all the states to include Canada and Mexico. State Flags were waved while their song was played.
- 4) Kendrick Castillo, the student killed in Colorado, was voted in as a Knight of Columbus by acclamation during the Supreme Knight's report. His parents were presented with the Caritas Award (very emotional) at the dinner.
- As Knights of Columbus, we are Knights of Unity.
 - 1) Membership: 1,989,016 members, 16,142 councils, college councils 390 with 36,559 College Brother Knights. 9,199 online members and 368,366 Fourth Degree Knights.
 - 2) In the past year we more than \$185 million dollars, more than 76 million hours of time and \$1.9 billion dollars' worth of time.
 - 3) Donated \$4.9 million to Special Olympics and other programs for people with intellectual disabilities. Donated almost 860 thousand hours to more than 180 events.
 - 4) Coats for kids: 1943 councils donated 171,264. Food for families: Donated 11 million of food and \$9.6 million to support soup kitchens and other programs. Habitat for humanity: \$566,873 dollars; 995,466 hours. Wheelchair mission: 390,413 donors. Since 2009 1`000 ultrasound machines have been placed in pregnancy centers.
 - 5) Insurance: \$1 billion in benefits (\$441 million in death and \$262 in dividends to members.

This Age of Distraction

"Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." — Gospel for Aug. 11, Lk 12:35-37

Semper Paratus— Latin for "always ready" — is the motto of the U.S. Coast Guard, but it could also serve as a motto for you and me in the Christian life. In this Gospel passage, Jesus calls us to constant vigilance. My brothers, we cannot allow our perimeter to be breached by temptations to anger, greed, lust and other sins. We do not know when we will be called to account. We all can recall someone whose sudden death reminds us that tomorrow is not guaranteed to anyone. May our master find us vigilant on his arrival! this month's Challenge This month, I challenge you to exercise daily vigilance with a simple examination of conscience at the end of each day. I also challenge you to keep watch with your council through the Faith In Action Holy Hour program, or by spending some time in Eucharistic adoration on your own. Questions for reflection: Is looking at your phone the first and the last thing you do each day? In this age of distraction, how can you sharpen your vigilance and focus for what is truly important? Did examining your conscience every day help increase your vigilance in your life?
