I must say at the start of my remarks that I was most deeply moved by the efforts of our Knights in their response to this disaster. Each home that I visited was faced with such utter destruction, but in almost every home that I visited I found usually 3 or four or more of our brother Knights helping out someone less fortunate than themselves. The outpouring of fraternal love, fellowship and charity was overwhelming. This continued on to our hall where food was being prepared, served and delivered. Our space serving as PODS and even helping by loaning our time and space to load up a cargo container of medical supplies for Puerto Rico. This list continues as does the outreach of my fellow Knights. I am so proud to be a part of a council that acted so quickly and with total self-giving. You all are a truly blessing from God!

I want to focus on this month of October....Respect Life Month. I know that we have already held our Chain of Life event on Pearland Parkway and 518 and it was a great success. A Shepherd's Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We continue our recovery efforts in the Archdiocese from Hurricane Harvey. So many of you are bearing a very heavy cross in patiently working through the many tasks to clean up and renew your homes and businesses after the catastrophic floods that visited us. Many others are assisting in aiding and helping the victims of the flood, providing financial assistance and, like all of us, praying for God's help in our needs and restoration. The outpouring of generosity in time and talent for those in need has been stupendous. May the Lord bless these continuous efforts. Let us not grow weary in the ensuing weeks and months.

Parts of the infrastructure of the Archdiocese have also suffered destruction with four churches inundated by flooding: St. Ignatius, Spring; Shrine of the True Cross, Dickinson; St. Francis of Assisi, North Side of Houston; and St. Philip the Apostle, Huffman. In addition, 60-plus other sites have reported various levels of damage from the flooding. The parishes themselves along with the Archdiocese have been energetically working to recover from this devastation, but time and patience will be necessary in the most affected places to bring the communities back together to their churches and schools. Our Catholic schools that have been damaged are of particular concern.

The outreach efforts by Catholic Charities, San José Clinic, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, the Knights of Columbus and other groups in our local Church have been magnificent; so too has been the help provided by individual parishes and associations here. We are blessed by their presence and their actions.

I believe that the people of Houston and beyond on the Gulf Coast of Texas have given an astonishing example of service, spontaneous help and love of our brothers and sisters, an example that has been noted in other parts of our country. These deeds of charity have come from those pure in heart and, amidst frequent divisions and rancor in our society, such deeds have shown a deeper solidarity and unity in our common humanity. May this spirit of unity continue in the ups and downs of rebuilding here in the months ahead. May the Lord Jesus calm any troubled waters and restore our tranquility.

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Tax Relief for Harvey Victims

President Trump just signed into law a measure for disaster relief aid passed by Congress. You can read the full text of the law here: https://www.congress.gov/bill/115th-congress/house-bill/601/text

The tax measures in the bill approved by the House would affect:

Casualty losses: Currently, taxpayers can deduct losses from their income taxes if they exceed 10% of adjusted gross income, and the taxpayer itemizes. Both of those requirements would be eliminated in the bill, so designated storm victims could write off all their losses, regardless of whether they itemize.

Retirement withdrawals: The bill would lift the 10% penalty on withdrawing funds from many retirement accounts, including IRAs, to pay for disaster recovery. It also would provide more flexibility for borrowing from accounts.

Expanded charitable deductions: The current limit on deducting charitable contributions — taxpayers generally can only deduct 50% of their income — would be lifted for donations to hurricane relief, so people making large gifts could write more of them off. It would also change rules for applying large write-offs to multiple years of tax returns.

Employment relief: A tax credit would be provided of 40% of wages, up to \$6,000 per employee for a disaster-affected employer from a core disaster area.

Check with your financial planner for more details about how to take these deductions on your taxes or withdrawals from your retirement accounts to pay for damages to your property.

The website keeps totals for our Grand Knight and Financial Secretary to know where we are, so it will be a huge help for the officers for you to take the time to enter those hours here.
