Filling column space reserved for Father Neville this month is one of the newest members of our council family, Father Anthony Vidal. Father Anthony and his parish, Mount Calvary Church in Baltimore City converted to Catholicism from the Anglican church this spring. He and his family live in Gamber. His journey of faith should serve as an inspiration to us all.

From the Thames to the Tiber

The Grand Knight asked me to write an occasional series of reflections on my journey to Catholicism. Let me begin by starting at the end.

In the 17th Chapter of the Gospel according to St. John Jesus' prayed for Unity: *"I do not pray for these only, but also for those who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one; even as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be in us"* (John 17:20-21 RSV, I urge you to read the whole chapter).

In the Anglican version of the Divine Liturgy we pray daily at Lauds: *"...we pray for thy holy Church universal; that it may be so guided and governed by thy good Spirit, that all who profess and call themselves Christians may be led into the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life"*. This is the same sentiment as Jesus prayed, but as much as we pray for it, we don't do it.

The fact is that we are not one but many. In a simplistic way we can describe our divisions as Catholicism, Orthodoxy and Protestantism. But Christianity Today reports that there are approximately 41,000 Christian denominations.

This is a scandal! It flies in the face of Jesus' prayer. But it's also consistent with Jesus' assertion *"I have other sheep, that are not of this fold"* and his promise *"I must bring them also,*

and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd”.

Jesus is clear that the Church, built upon the rock of Peter, is his flock and that he wants to lead us all to its fold, so that there will be one flock with Jesus as its Shepherd. As a result, in obedience to my Lord, I felt compelled to become part of this flock and “swam across the Tiber”. I will write more articles on lessons and nudges I received along the way in future issues.

40 days for Life

As I am writing this the 40 days for Life campaign has kicked off. I received an e-mail from their organization today:

I'm going to keep the location confidential for this first story.

"I received a call from a woman telling me she had gotten information about our campaign from a local church," a local leader said, "and she wanted to know if she could help. Her voice was a little broken, as she explained to me that people just don't realize how they might feel later."

The caller went on to say that women who think abortion is the answer just don't realize that years later, they'll be wondering about the baby - what they would have looked like, what they might have gone on to do. They also don't realize that God will hold them accountable for what they've done.

"As she was saying these things, and trying to speak clearly, she was sobbing between her words," the leader said. "I could hear the pain in her voice."

Finally, the 40 Days for Life volunteer asked her, "Ma'am, did you have an abortion?"

In tears, the caller answered, "No, but my daughter did. She was 15 at the time and I was going through a divorce. She was so young. We thought it was the best thing." She considered herself responsible.

The woman was quickly told that the Lord is always ready to forgive and Rachel's Vineyard, for instance, offers retreats for healing after abortion. She was also told about the pro-life pregnancy help center and the services it offers.

The woman expressed relief and gratitude.

"40 Days for Life is about so much more than what we may originally think," the leader said. "I did not expect that call. It was totally heart-wrenching. I have been so blessed to be part of this -- to see the power of God working and to

be part of helping someone to heal in some small way. Please know ... you are making a difference!"

If you can please get involved, if you cannot please pray for the protestors, abortionist and the woman who are seeking an abortion, and ask God to intervene.

Update on Question 6 - Civil Marriage Protection Act

"Establishes that Maryland's civil marriage laws allow gay and lesbian couples to obtain a civil marriage license, provided they are not otherwise prohibited from marrying; protects clergy from having to perform any particular marriage ceremony in violation of their religious beliefs; affirms that each religious faith has exclusive control over its own theological doctrine regarding who may marry within that faith; and provides that religious organizations and certain related entities are not required to provide goods, services, or benefits to an individual related to the celebration or promotion of marriage in violation of their religious beliefs."

This is where it counts:

- "For" = allow same-sex marriages within the State of Maryland.
- "Against" = would overturn the law.

Question 6 is becoming a topic that both sides are spending time and money. There had been polls that showed supporters are gaining, up to 51%. There were ads featuring Catholic couples who states "I'm going to vote my conscience and vote for Question 6 in November," the ad said. Again, this does not represent the bigger picture. Maryland is not alone, three states of Maine, Minnesota and Washington is also in the crusade to vote against the same sex marriage. We are all aware that donors from out of state, including the Hollywood celebrities, major corporations, and the Liberal politicians will be influencing the Maryland voters. This is their nationwide effort to raise more money to finally win at the ballot boxes in other states. The same-sex marriage vote has lost a total of 32 referendums in several states. True to faith, we are not all celebrities. We are the citizens to uphold the moral code.

Our Faith Should Transform Our Politics

The start of the Year of Faith and our country's elections will take place less than a month apart. And we have an excellent opportunity as Catholics to apply the principles of our faith to our political system -- not only in how we vote, but in how we choose to influence our country's political discourse, too often marred by angry and hateful rhetoric.

In this effort, two themes from Pope Benedict's message announcing the Year of Faith are of great importance to Catholic Americans.

First, he called for public witness by Catholics, writing: "Faith implies public testimony and commitment. A Christian may never think of belief as a private act. Faith, precisely because it is a free act, also demands social responsibility for what one believes."

Second, he called on Catholics to redouble their commitment to charity: "Faith without charity bears no fruit," he wrote.

Seldom does America suffer a more profound lack of charity today than in its political process.

Often, we see that commentators and politicians don't see the ideas of their political adversaries as deficient. They see their political adversaries themselves as personally deficient.

The result is an almost endless cycle of personal attacks in our country's political conversation.

For the vast majority of Americans -- who know how to have civil disagreements over everything including politics with family and friends -- this doesn't sit well. Our K of C-Marist poll has found that almost 8 in 10 Americans say they are "frustrated" with the tone of our political debates. Almost three-quarters say the problem is getting worse and just under two-thirds say this is harming our political process.

But we need not accept this status quo as "good enough."

Now numbering one in four Americans, our country's Catholics can offer a better alternative.

Charity demands respectful discourse -- on every issue. For this reason, the Knights of Columbus launched the Civility in America petition, asking politicians and the media to focus on debates on issues and policies rather than on personal attacks.

Cardinal Timothy Dolan has asked both presidential candidates and their running mates to sign it, joining the more than 1 million members of the Knights of Columbus and more than 25,000 other Americans supporting it.

Such a project is consistent with the best of Catholic thought.

In "The City of God," St. Augustine observed, "Let this city bear in mind, that among her enemies lie hidden those who are destined to be fellow citizens, that she may not think it a fruitless labor to bear what they inflict as enemies until they become confessors of the truth."

And St. Thomas More wrote this prayer while awaiting execution in the Tower of London for refusing to take an oath supporting King Henry

VIII's takeover of the Catholic Church in England:

"Almighty God, have mercy on all that bear me evil will, and would me harm, and their faults and mine together... vouchsafe to amend and redress, make us saved souls in heaven together, where we may ever live and love together with thee and thy blessed saints."

We are called to public witness in all circumstances.

In the early days of evangelization, when St. Paul preached to the Athenians, he chose to do so at the Areopagus: a powerful council, and the oldest in Athens. Those men who made up the Areopagus were not Christians: that was precisely why they needed to be evangelized.

With Cardinal Dolan calling for civility from our political candidates and delivering prayers at both the conventions of both the Republicans and the Democrats, a descendant of the apostles is once again bringing Christ's message into the halls of power.

Today, most in both political parties are Christian -- and many are Catholic -- but the call to conversion is endless. In what is becoming an increasingly secularized country -- where many believe religion ought to be kept out of our modern Areopagus -- this form of new evangelization is timely and needed.

By calling on our candidates and the media to show charity and civility, Catholics can help Cardinal Dolan and our bishops to bring the new evangelization to our own public square as St. Paul did in Athens.

By witnessing to charity and civility in our own discussions and our own lives, we can lead the way and show that such a goal is attainable.

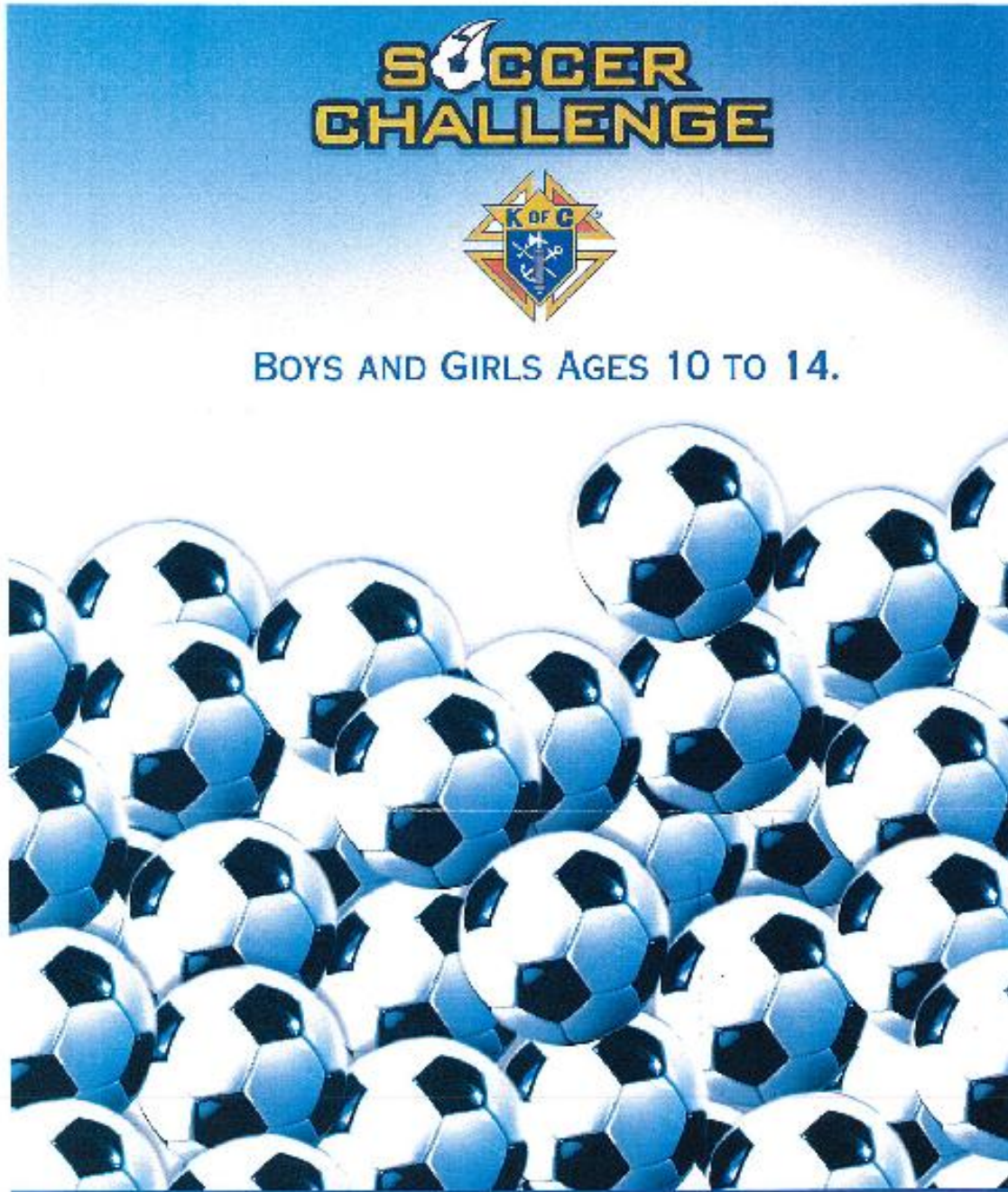
