# Chaplain's Message

So, what do you make of the month of November?

I like variety in life; and the month of November has certainly scattered a rich mix of experiences to me in the past – with a promise of more interesting endowments in the present and in the future.

This is cheating a bit. But I'd like to include Halloween within the catalogue of this eleventh month. As a grade school kid it was wonderful to canvass the neighborhood for free treats – mostly candy and even a small box of cold breakfast cereal. But I don't remember activating or being the butt of any tricks. I do remember, however, considering several misdemeanors. My dad actually boasted of taking apart a vehicle of some sort and reassembling it on a roof-top – and tipping over outhouses. My friends and I were not that ambitious. We did talk about "beating up" some smaller kids and confiscating their collected treats. But we never took steps in that direction.

Being an outdoor enthusiast, I experienced the conclusion of the bird-hunting season and eventually participating in the very brief gun deer hunting season. My dad and his buddies never missed the opening weekend. Starting in seventh grade I was included with these "old guys." We brought home little venison, but the fresh air, physical challenge and adventure were always very stimulating and much appreciated.

Thanksgiving Day was a solemn, almost religious event in my family – until the death of my second parent and the dispersal of my older sisters. Besides having wine (Mogen David) at table, it was the custom – while my grandmother was still alive and came to our house for this dinner – that she was entitled to the "Pope's Nose" or "piece-that- goes-over-the-fence-last." We never had turkey on our table, but feasted on chicken or pheasant. After my parents 20<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary we dined on real China plates. I was then excused from wiping dishes afterwards for fear that some of the fine China might not survive my handling.

One of the best offerings of November was the Feast of All Saints, which meant a day off from school for us who attended Catholic grade or high schools. And I possessed such eligibility. That provided us with more free time to gobble up the recently gathered candy and play some football.

November 2 – All Souls Day - required a return to the Classroom. But it also put us into the renewed observance of an ancient Christian practice - the remembrance of our own deceased family members, relatives and friends. Memorial Day in our country is basically focused on the life-giving deaths of those who have participated in our various military branches and adventures. It is intended as a thoughtful, patriotic holiday. But All Souls Day is a multi-national, religious, centuries-old tradition extended to a much broader, inclusive clientele.

Extend my list, as you wish, and prioritize the observances, as you wish. Whatever! But November also serves as the threshold to Winter. So be it!
