

The Knights of Columbus organization values each charity hour at \$22.55. That means that for only the first six months of this year our council has donated over \$67,500 worth of charity hours. As a whole organization the Knights of Columbus have donated \$170,135,754 in contributions. It doesn't come without sacrifice, it doesn't come without work, but we can make that effort fun.
