KNIGHTS

Religious Liberty

"It is in accordance with their dignity that all men, because they are persons, that is, beings endowed version and therefore personal responsibility, are both impelled by their nature and bound by a moral obligation to seek the truth, especially religious truth. They are also bound to adhere to the truth once they come to know it and direct their whole lives in accordance with the demands of truth. But men cannot satisfy this obligation in a way that is in keeping with their own nature unless they enjoy both psychological freedom and immunity from external coercion. Therefore the right to religious freedom has its foundation not in the subjective attitude of the individual but in his very nature."

The Knights of Columbus promotes a robust vision of religious liberty that embraces religion's proper role in both its private and public dimensions. As both Catholics and Americans, we celebrate the essential relationship shared between religion and liberty, a relationship which has uniquely defined our country's identity and has fostered our country's development.

Every major achievement that has taken place within the American enterprise—the American Revolution; the abolition of slavery; the civil rights movement; reforms in education, labor and woman's rights—has been at the urging of religious people seeking a more just and humane society.

In this light, the Knights of Columbus recognizes religious liberty as an indispensable condition for authentic human development.

Consistent with the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we believe that man, created in the image and likeness of God, possesses the natural right to be recognized as a free and responsible being, especially in moral and religious matters. Our Order remains steadfast in its conviction that religious liberty "is an inalienable requirement of the dignity of the human person." (Catechism, 1738).

We are therefore called to defend religious liberty against cultural trends that are increasingly hostile to Christianity, and impede men and women from freely exercising their religion by living in accordance with it. As the Second Vatican Council noted, although we must respect the just autonomy of the secular sphere, we must take into consideration the truth that there is no realm of worldly affairs that can be separated from God.

St. John Paul II witnessed that when a society attempts to close the door to religion, it inevitably falls prey to a totalitarian reading of the human person that recognizes only the state as the ultimate arbiter of right and wrong. It is our duty as men of both Catholic faith and patriotism to resist militant secularism and to defend religious liberty at the international, national, state, and local levels. Without this necessary check on the power of the state, no principled limit can be recognized to prevent the expansion of government's power at the expense of personal liberty.

In the end, the Knights of Columbus investment strategy is motivated by morality, not money. Yet, each year we remain profitable, increase our assets and stay dedicated to this vision that will keep the Order financially sound for generations to come.

"Faithful Catholics have choices when buying life insurance," said the Supreme Knight. "But they know that at the Knights of Columbus their policy is supplied by an insurer that shares their moral and ethical values and is guided in all of its investment and sales practices by those values."

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

As you may have read or heard, the District Deputy pulled our Certification for our First Degree Team. As it stands right now, we are unable to hold a First Degree at Nativity. This is obviously a disadvantage to our Council not being able to hold a Degree at our campus for new members, or having the ability to schedule one as needed (like after our membership blitz).

What can you do about it? We are forming a new Degree Team and hope to be certified soon. But to do this we need Degree Team Members. There are many roles on the degree team, from the main players such as the Chancellor and Deputy Grand Knight that have large speaking roles, to medium roles with smaller speaking parts like the Financial Secretary, one or two liners like the inside guard, to non –speaking roles such as the Wardens' Aides and the Music Man. Basically a role for you, no matter what your talent or experience. The Degree team is not a huge time commitment (we are usually scheduled for a degree every other month (so only six a year!) and an occasional special degree secession on an off month as needed (very rarely), plus the occasion practice.

Ideally we would like to have a main player for each role and a backup. If you have any interest at all for any of the roles please reach out to Chris McManus or Herb Swoope. Remember, the future of our Council's membership may depend on your participation!

Service Program Awards

Each year state councils honor the best program or activity in the areas Church, community, council, family, culture of life, and youth at their state conventions. Any council not under suspension is eligible to enter. Each jurisdiction is responsible for selecting the single best Church, community, council, family, culture of life and youth activity program conducted by an individual council in the 12-month period between the state/provincial conventions.

Each year the top international winners are honored at the Supreme Knight's Awards Session at the annual Supreme Convention.

Entries are judged first and foremost on the effectiveness of the program. The content of the award application itself, however, is extremely important in conveying to the judges just how effective the program was. A few simple pointers can assist your council in producing winning entries and can improve your council's chances of being recognized as having some of the best programs Orderwide.
