Dear Brother Knights:

November is here and four months of the Columbian Year have passed...as we prepare for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas we need to reflect back on the past four months and recall the goals established in July and our progress made towards those goals.

Every District Deputy was asked to bring in two new members per district, per month. Many of our 71 District Deputies have not met this goal. In fact, as of the end of October, the State of New Jersey has taken in only 325 new members for the entire Columbian Year. At this pace, we will not bring in 1,000 new members for this Columbian Year – our goal set by Supreme is 2,200 members. We have time this year to rebound from this weak start and we need to reflect on where we have been and where we are going!

In the State of New Jersey, 245 councils have not brought in a single new member this year. There are approximately 340 active councils in New Jersey – that means that 72% of the active councils have not brought in a new member this Columbian Year. Being a glass is half full guy, I look at this as an opportunity for the remaining eight months of the Columbian Year. Moving forward, I am asking every member of the Order to bring in one new member this year. Ask your family members...do you have a member of your family who will be turning 18 in the next couple of months? When that family member is filling out their voter registration form, have them fill out a Form 100. What a great gift. What about that catholic gentleman you see at mass every week. You sit next to each other...you politely say hello to each other every week...do you even know his name? Introduce yourself and introduce him to the principles of Columbianism. As we have always been told, the reason men have never joined is the Order is that they have never been asked.

I look forward to meeting with the District Deputies at their Mid Term meeting on Dec 8 and with Council Officers around the state at the Mid Term Grand Knight meetings scheduled for several Saturdays in January, 2019. If you are the Grand Knight and can not attend, please make sure that your council is represented. If the State Membership Team can be of assistance to you or your council, please feel free to reach out to us.

May the Holy Season of Advent be a time of prayerful reflection and service to others for you, your family, and your Council.

Brother Knights,

In light of the recent resignation of Brother Hal Delaney, FDD, I would like to thank him for his excellent work with all the State Council Programs. I am honored to have been asked to assume his role as we continue the vital mission of the Order. As a Catholic, fraternal, service organization, we perform so many great charitable works that help our Catholic Church, our community, and those less fortunate or vulnerable. In doing so, we receive great personal satisfaction and, fortunately, we are able to extend an offer of membership to those eligible so they, too, can share in this feeling. Remember that Membership and Programs go hand-in-hand. To keep our Order vibrantly alive, we must continue to bring in new members to help expand our programs and, likewise, we must offer worthwhile programs to attract new members. Therefore, I ask that you implement some new programs during this year and exemplify the principals of our Order for all in the community to see.

The goal of every Council should be the Star Council Award, and one of its components is the Columbian Award which demonstrates excellence in service programs and charitable outreach. Every functioning council should be able to fulfill this program requirement with some thoughtful planning! Besides filing the Report of Chosen Officers (Form 185), the Service Program Personnel Report (Form 365 due 8/1/18), the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (Form 1728 due 1/31/19), and the Columbian Award Application (Form SP-7 due 6/30/19), as well as remaining in good standing with Supreme Council assessments, there are three important additional requirements which are explained further in the Faith in Action Guidebook (Form 10590):

- 1) Full compliance with <u>SAFE ENVIRONMENT</u> requirements including prompt training for the Grand Knight and Program Director, as well as prompt training and background checks for the Family Director and Community Director.
- 2) Four mandatory programs (one for each "Faith in Action" category): For Faith: Spiritual Reflection, For Family: Consecration to the Holy Family, For Community: Helping Hands, For Life: Novena for Life.
- 3) Total of FOUR major programs (1 mandatory above and 3 others) in <u>EACH</u> of the Service Program categories: FAITH, FAMILY, COMMUNITY, and LIFE. (16 programs in all)

PROGRAM of the MONTH PATRIOTIC CORNER

With Thanksgiving this month and Christmas next month, that means it is getting to be time for indoor activities for the children. This is a great time to start planning your Council's Free Throw Tournament, which will take place in January. With School and Township Tournaments under way, it might be wise to reserve a gym now, don't wait until January.

The Tournament is open to boys and girls age 9 – 14. The child's age is determined by the age they are on January 1, 2019. Children under 9 or older than 14 on that date may not compete in the "Official Tournament", but that doesn't mean you can't hold a Council Tournament for the younger children, or a 3 pt competition for the older children

Free Throw Tournament kits can be ordered from Supreme or if you have forms left over from previous years, you may use them.

Competitors $\underline{\text{MUST}}$ be accompanied by a parent or guardian and $\underline{\text{MUST}}$ bring a copy of their birth certificate to every round of the Tournament they compete in.

After the Council competition is completed in January, your District Deputy will hold a round in February and the winners of the District Round will advance to the Diocesan Round in March. The Diocesan winners will compete in the State Finals, scheduled for early April 2019. Letters will be provided informing the Diocesan Champions of the location and time schedule for the State Finals.

In the past few years, we have had some of our State Champions go on to win the International competition and we hope to be fortunate again.

Brother Knights,

November is National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness month. As discussed in last month's article, I hope all councils have planned a fundraiser or "shake the can" weekend to raise funds for **Alzheimer's Caregiver Respite Care**. See this LINK for where to send your donation. Even if you didn't specifically raise funds for this cause, you may still send a council check to help out!

Another Special Program truly needing your help is the Autism Awareness and Family **Support** program. Autism is the fastest growing disability in this country with the highest incidence rate in NJ where one in 41 persons are born with or develop autism. These families desperately need your support while they struggle with trying to understand their child's needs. They struggle with school systems that don't understand their special learning needs, and with a general public that thinks they don't know how to discipline their child. Through the "Autism Awareness and Family Support Program", the State Council is asking you to support the 501(c)(3) organization Parents Of Autistic Children (POAC) www.poac.net. In addition, POAC provides free recreational events for children and adults with autism and their siblings throughout the year. Naturally, New Jersey Right to Life will again be holding its Rally at the Statehouse in Trenton.

The 20/20 Project. The postcard campaign to pass the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act continues! INSURANCE MATTERS

Who do you love more, the government or your family?

That is the question. Who do you love more, the IRS/state of New Jersey or your family? Poor planning ahead of time causes the government to get a great deal more of your hard earned nest egg.

First thing you have to do is ask yourself, "When I'm gone who do I want to get my stuff and my money?" Then you need to plan to do so.

I recently had to tell a 70 year old that when he dies, the money in his annuity will be taxable to his heirs. He didn't know that the gain, (the interest earned), was taxable at the time of the distribution. He also didn't know that the remainder of his 401K, however much will be there, is also taxable to beneficiaries. (And that it those heirs are under 59 ½, they also pay a 10% penalty to the IRS). Lastly, he didn't know that when he dies, (as he expects to go before his wife), that she will lose her social security check, (she will get his since it is larger, but the surviving spouse only gets one check not both).

Retirement is not about how much you have. It's about replacing the income you used to make when your work. Dying without a will, (Intestate), means that you don't even get to decide who gets your stuff. A judge at the

surrogate's court will appoint an attorney, at \$150-\$200 an hour to figure out what you have and who should get it.

One thing to remember, is that even with a will you go through probate, but you can lower probate fees by properly structuring some of your assets so that



they don't go through probate. Ask your agent how we can make that happen.

Estate planning is not just about where will we be buried, it's about how to get the assets that you want to leave to your heirs, (kids, grandkids, charity), to those beneficiaries without the government taking a large piece, (or any piece). Father McGivney's dream was that no Catholic family would suffer financially from the loss of a loved one.....today I think he would also want every Catholic family to keep as much of their hard earned assets as they legally can.

These are the topics that your Knights of Columbus insurance agent can help you with. That way, the people you love and not Trenton or Washington will get your assets when you pass.
