A Shepherd's Message

A new Liturgical year happens more quietly than the opening of the civil year. The Church opens her yearly celebrations of the mystery of Christ with the season of Advent, a few weeks of preparation for Christmas and also for the coming of Christ in glory at the end of time. Advent does not ask us to “play act” the historical coming of Jesus as though we were unaware of his conception and birth 2000+ years ago. It does not ask to fear his Second Coming. Advent invites. Advent persuades. Against the noise and frantic pace of what we may daily live or endure, Advent requests some time of quiet, genuine moments of slowing down to listen, a space of silence, however brief. The prayers and Scriptures Readings, the music and practices of Advent are a slow motion experience of joy.

We know that Christ came among us and is among us. We know Him. But we also do not know Him. He is always in advance of us coming to meet us anew. As our friend, Savior and Lord there is never a time when we cannot deepen His friendship, His saving power in us and the power of His Kingdom still coming in the world. Pope Francis keeps insisting on our encounter with Jesus which produces a knowledge and vigor that sends us out to meet others. Knowledge of Jesus in the heart sends us out as missionaries. Jesus is always Someone “new,” who always allows us to see another person as new.

Advent is the yearly season of the Church year for newness. This is why we can read the Old Testament writings of the Prophet Isaiah, the well-known preaching of John the Baptist, and the astounding attentiveness to the Lord of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the initial chapters of the Gospel of St. Luke, the Annunciation, the Visitation and the Nativity, and read them as new discoveries! These Readings may seem old, repetitive, but Advent adds freshness to habit. The reading is not mechanical, but vital.

Even at the time of John the Baptist, Israel was waiting and waiting in hope, waiting for something it already possessed in an angled way. The Baptist, the One who runs in advance, makes specific that Israel is waiting for God, for the person of the Messiah. This is Good News for the poor: the poor are central to the various themes of Advent. Some are poor materially, some are not destitute but are impoverished in heart, mind and spirit. Jesus announces the good news even in the poverty of His birth, in His humility of spirit, in his total dedication to the Father. So intense is this sense of poverty that the season of Advent/Christmas has left its mark on being generous, of sharing our resources and our very selves with those who are poor or in need in a variety of ways. An Advent not marked by notice of the poor, outreach to the poor, attentiveness to those spiritually poor is an incomplete Advent, a torso without a head. The head gives direction! As members of the Body of Christ we respond to the Lord in Advent with great generosity, with greetings cards and gifts for others. In such encounters we gain a great increase in the knowledge and intimate friendship with Jesus. Remember the poor.

Take advantage of our own spiritual poverty by being reconciled this Advent in the Sacrament of Reconciliation by repairing wounded relationships and friendships, by treasuring the beauty of the earth, by a silent watchfulness and waiting for the Lord Jesus. Let the cloak, the tilma of the Virgin Mary of Guadalupe warm you and take you anew to hear the message of the Advent Scriptures. The Lord is coming and will not delay. He stands at the door and knocks. If any of us listen to his voice and opens the door for him, he will come to us and sit down to supper with us and we with him.

A Blessed Advent. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us!

The Knights of Columbus Aids Christians in the Middle East

Vice President Mike Pence pledged that the U.S. government will provide direct aid to Christians in the Middle East, singling out the Knights of Columbus for “extraordinary work caring for the persecuted around the world.”

U.S. aid had previously been given to the United Nations for distribution in the troubled region. Speaking at the In Defense of Christians Fourth Annual Solidarity Dinner in Washington, Pence said that the aid had been ineffective in helping Christians who have suffered at the hands of ISIS and other terrorist groups. “While faith-based groups with proven track records and deep roots in these communities are more than willing to assist, the United Nations too often denies their funding requests,” Pence said. “My friends, those days are over. This is the moment. This is the time. And America will support these people in their hour of need.” The news was a milestone for the Knights of Columbus, which has led the effort to protect Christians amid a genocide in the Middle East.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson introduced Pence at the dinner, stating that now was the time to “rededicate ourselves to the defense of our brothers and sisters in faith — and to defending them in a Christian way with the ethics of love. Despite the efforts of so many, the world witnesses again and again the crimes against humanity that we now describe as genocide,” Anderson told an audience that included elected officials, bishops, priests and prelates from the U.S. and throughout the Middle East. “Today that word is rightly applied to what is happening to Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East.”

In August, the Knights announced plans to raise \$2 million to rebuild Karamles, a predominantly Christian town in Iraq that was destroyed by ISIS. The Knights’ drive will enable hundreds of families from Christian and other minority communities, who were evicted by ISIS in 2014, to move back to their homes.

The Knights are urging K of C councils, along with parishes and other Church groups, to donate \$2,000, the approximate cost of resettling one family. Since 2014, the Knights of Columbus Christian Refugee Relief Fund has donated more than \$17 million for humanitarian assistance in Iraq, Syria and the surrounding region. The Knights’ documentation of ISIS atrocities and its advocacy efforts were instrumental in the 2016 decision by then-Secretary of State John Kerry to declare the treatment of Christians and other religious minorities in the region as genocide. Current Secretary of State Rex Tillerson reaffirmed that designation earlier this year. Vice President Pence praised the Knights, saying the organization’s efforts had been instrumental in raising awareness of the genocide in the region.

In Defense of Christians also honored U.S. Representative Chris Smith for his extensive work on behalf of Christians in the Middle East. Smith, a representative from New Jersey, is a key ally of the Knights of Columbus. In Defense of Christians is a nonprofit, nonpartisan human rights advocacy group based in Washington. The dinner was part of a multiday summit that included meetings about the issues in the Middle East, along with lobbying of members of Congress. “Scripture tells us that those who lead many to righteousness shall ‘shine like the stars forever,’” Supreme Knight Anderson said in his introduction of the vice president. “There has never been a more righteous cause than the defense of those helpless ones being led to slaughter.”

- The 2018 "Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage (WTL)" will take place 15-22 May during the 60th Annual Military Pilgrimage (PMI) in Lourdes, France, 18-20 May and is sponsored by the Archdiocese for the Military Service (AMS), USA, and the Knights of Columbus (KofC)
- Active duty and recently retired or separated (Post 9/11) non wounded, wounded, ill or injured, military personnel from CONUS and Europe travel to Lourdes for a time of rest, prayer, healing, peace, and reconciliation
- All expenses for approved non-wounded, wounded, ill, or injured military personnel, as well as their designated caregivers, will be covered by Knights Of Columbus Charities, Inc. Companions are invited to attend, and may be offered needs-based financial assistance on a case-by-case basis
- The AMS-KofC package rate for companions and volunteers traveling from the United States to Lourdes is \$2600 for double occupancy room and \$2900 for a single occupancy room.
- All packages include roundtrip flight from either Atlanta; Houston; Los Angeles; Seattle; Washington, DC; Raleigh-Durham; or NYC/JFK. as well as lodging, a full meal plan, and PMI credentials. KofC will book flights from nearest local airport for all pilgrims not living in or around the 7 departure cities. Please note that ALL pilgrims are responsible for their own ground transportation to their departure airport
- Full details on the WTL Pilgrimage, the PMI, Lourdes, the AMS, and the KofC, along with the WTL application can be found at www.warriorstolourdes.com. The application period opened 15 September 2017. All applications and payments (if applicable) are due by 15 January 2018. Applications will be reviewed by the KofC pilgrimage leadership team and medical director for selection. All applicants will be notified of the status of their application beginning 15 February 2018
