

Serving as directors are these officers, present Grand Knight, Iturba Percefull, and a past Grand Knight, George Marshall.

Part of the meeting was devoted to the Financial Report, prepared by **Gil Gibbons**, who was unable to be present. Gil's report showed a savings account balance of \$25,000 and a checking account balance of \$3,995 as well as contingencies of

\$11,600 to protect the operation of the Bill Kagel Bar and \$5,838.75 for the annual payment of costs related to delivery of city water. The report

also shows that our two large standing expenditures for 2007 are hall insurance of \$1668 and real estate taxes of \$1877. These two expenses of course vary each year, with the amount generally increasing.
