Scheduling could be varied to accommodate events, such as the Super Bowl or prize fights. Food for thought and grounds for further investigation.

Father Michael J. McGivney identified young men as a most crucial segment among our parishioners, in that they tend to be the most fallen away and at risk. Before he formed Knights of Columbus, he was successful in creating a theater group, the Young Men's Total Abstinence and Literary (TAL) Society. With explosive growth, they put on acting shows and made money for charity. The purpose was to give purpose and to turn away from alcoholism the young men who had become bored with church life.

Fr. McGivney's love allowed his soul to become the battleground as all healers must do. "Finding himself in the midst of the battlefield, man has to struggle to do what is right, and it is at great cost to himself, and aided by God's grace that he succeed in achieving his own inner integrity." (CCC409) the mysterious alchemy, whereby the victim becomes the victor, played out in this man as he discovers the first task of love is self-purification. He then found in the struggle between good and evil that life has its meaning and hope in goodness. What is apparent in his life is that love conquering evil was a priori position for him.

To love evil is evil. To love the evil-doer is the call. The methodology of love seeks to shine a light into evil's ugliness—its small, cheap, tawdry dreariness—boring, gloomy, and lonely, where a nihilistic black silence hangs like a shroud. The soul of the lover is buoyant. It does not fear; it is purposeful. Its delight is for others, fulfilled and fulfilling. I've always thought that the title of a Beatles song is a major maxim: "All You Need Is Love."
