At the end of November Pope Benedict will hold what is called a consistory and elevate 23 men to the rank of Cardinal in the Church. It is a distinction the Pope gives at certain times to call attention to a particular diocese or person. In function a cardinal is not above a bishop. A cardinal who is the head of a diocese is not more powerful than if he

were a bishop. The greatest difference is that cardinals under the age of 80 vote for the pope when the time of election comes. Cardinals may also be called upon to advise the pope as he deems necessary.

From Our Chaplain

In the world there are 202 cardinals, and with 17 the United States has the second largest number of any country after Italy. Two have been added with the latest announcement. One is Archbishop John Foley, who has spent more of his time directing the office for communications for the Vatican. He would often offer commentary for the St. Peter's Midnight Mass that is broadcast in the United States. For him the title is a mark of honor following many years of faithful service to the Church. The second will no doubt draw more attention. He is Archbishop Daniel DiNardo of Houston. This is the first time the state of Texas has had a cardinal. For him to be named a cardinal is to draw attention to the changing church in the United States. In the last 25 years the Catholic population in that diocese has doubled to 1.4 million.

Archbishop DiNardo explains why he may have been chosen. "The growth of the Catholic population in the southern part of the United States in recent years is something extraordinary. I think what the Holy Father and the Holy See is saying is the whole South and Southwestern part of the U.S. with the rise of Hispanics obviously a major part, is a noteworthy and beautiful addition for the Catholic Church in the U.S."

The naming of Archbishop DiNardo as a cardinal is an honor for the entire church but for the U.S. in particular. Many of the changes that drew attention have happened to some degree in Arkansas as well. We now offer our prayers for the entire church and those called to this role. May they use their voice well in conveying the Truth of Jesus Christ to a changing world./Fr. Erik
