I was grateful for a phone call I received from our Grand Knight a couple of weeks ago. He was asking for the name of a seminarian that could be supported by our local council. I want to take this opportunity to express my gratitude for the work of the Knights with vocations. April 13th is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations and that fits well into efforts of the Knights for many years. Currently the Knights have a campaign to promote vocations called "Keep the Faith Alive."

In an effort to guide the Church on April 13, Pope Benedict has written a short document on vocations, and I would like to share a portion of it with you: "Vocations to the ministerial priesthood and to the consecrated life can only flourish in a spiritual soil that is well cultivated. Christian communities that live the missionary dimension of the mystery of the Church in a profound way will never be inward looking. Mission, as a witness of divine love, becomes particularly effective when it is shared in a community, 'so that the world may believe' (cf. Jn 17:21)."

It seems to me that these lines speak well to the work of the Knights for vocations. For young men in parishes it is vital to see other men committed to their faith and willing to use their time well for service and the work of the Church. Your example as Knights can have an impact beyond what is readily seen. Your support of vacations is much needed in the Church today. The direct financial support of seminarians is greatly appreciated, but your work in helping create a faith community where young men can hear God's call is equally important. May God continue to "Keep the Faith Alive" by our efforts and our prayer./In Christ, Fr. Erik
