I remember after we chartered in 1972 when I became Grand Knight. With the help of Father Cooper, we contacted the Bishop to see if we could rent St. Gabriel's Church on East Grand since it was vacant. In the letter to the Bishop,

we explained to him that since we had just chartered and had very little money, we could pay only approximately \$50 a month. He agreed to lease us the church and its rectory for that amount. We were able to sub-lease the rectory for \$80 a month. Extra money! We all rolled up our sleeves and went to work. We renovated the inside of the building but still did not have restrooms or a kitchen.

During this time Hot Springs was under a building ban, and we could not do any new plumbing. With the help of a few knights, we went down at night and "boot-legged" the plumbing into the building. There were many long days of work for most of the knights then since most of them still had full-time jobs to do during the day. They would go straight from work to our new Hall on East Grand to work. During these months of work to install our restrooms, a kitchen, and a bar, our meetings were working-meetings. Everyone helped.

Ironically, after 35 years, here I am again as Grand Knight, doing some of the same things I did when we first chartered. (I love every minute of it!)/ Joe Giompoletti, Grand Knight Editor's Postscript: Our Grand Knight continues to take the lead in the renovation work at the K. C. Hall. With the women's restroom, kitchen, and air-conditioning/heating now in good order, construction on the men's restroom is underway. The sheetrock is in place, and the taping is almost complete. A new restroom, with a very different look, will be completed soon.

The Council, recent recipient of an anonymous \$12,000 donation, is soon to receive another generous gift of \$12, 589.63 from the estate of former council member Emil Wencil who died several months ago.
