privacy stall and urinal partitions as well as the mirror that will complete the restroom renovation. Thanks to **Rick Sands**, **Dennis Bosch**, **and Tom Gilleran** for their excellent work in laying the bathroom tiles. Thanks to **Newton White**, **Jim Witovec**, **Rick Sands**, **Jim Lockwood**, **and Ray Kukuk**, who helped me with clean-up and brush-cutting along the entrance to the K. C. Hall property.

On September 10 the K. C. Hall was burglarized, with entrance first through the storage room door and then by prying loose the door into the kitchen. On the morning of September 11, Dick Smith checked on the building and found that it had been broken into, then called **Dennis** and me. Dennis reported the break-in to the Sheriff's Department, who sent someone out to make a report. We found nothing missing except a fivegallon container of gasoline. The door to the storage area was damaged beyond repair, and that day Dennis and I replaced it with a steel door. The four-foot steel door to the kitchen was badly damaged. I loaded it onto my truck and took it home, straightened it out and repainted it. Brother Knights, at this time that steel door is replaced with three slides. So when you lock the storage room door, lock all three deadbolts, please. Our total cost of repairing and replacing both doors came to approximately \$175.00, so therefore we didn't file an insurance claim.

Please do not build a fire in the fireplace. With the help of **John Ledbetter and Dennis**, we doubled a tarp, strapped it down with a binder in hopes that this will keep the water from coming in around the fireplace. We had significant water when Gustav and Ike blew into Hot Springs.

Ray Kukuk has made some badly needed repairs on the collection box for aluminum cans located beside Classic Wheels and Tires at 901 Albert Pike. Thanks to Ray for repainting, lettering and re-roofing the box. Julian Post, with Ray's help, continues periodically to collect the cans to sell them for the council's benefit.
