### **Patriotism – The Fourth Degree**

Brothers,

We are blessed to be American Catholics. I thank the Lord regularly that my ancestors had the fortitude to get up and leave everything they knew to board a ship and set sail for America more than one hundred years ago. They had few belongings. They were not educated and did not speak the language. They knew few people if any in the USA. But they came. I imagine that the small group of men who first met with Fr. McGivney in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut in October 1881 were a lot like many of our predecessors.

Going back further, this country was founded upon the principal of religious liberty. Many people came here from other lands to escape persecution and to practice the faith of their choice. The framers themselves spelled out religious freedom in the very First Amendment.

We are well aware that much has changed, to the point where religious *intolerance* is becoming increasingly acceptable in certain circles of our society. But we ask ourselves, “What can I do about it?”

We can pray and give witness for others. I present the Knights of Columbus program called “Pray the Rosary for Religious Liberty,” which was founded by Council 783 in 2012 – in light of the US government’s health care mandate. The program runs monthly from May through October following selected masses. Knights of Columbus lead a prayer service in a visible location, reflecting upon the message of Our Lady of Fatima and praying the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary – in the name of religious freedom and rights of conscience. The program will begin this year on May 9-10.

So if you see a group of the faithful in public prayer, join us. If you would like to represent the Knights and participate in the program, call me. This program is taking on new significance as Christians are persecuted and martyred around the world. If we continue to remain silent and keep to ourselves, we have no right in the future to ask, “How did this happen?”

Martin Niemöller (1892–1984) was a prominent Protestant pastor who emerged as an outspoken public foe of Adolf Hitler and spent the last seven years of Nazi rule in concentration camps.

Niemöller is best remembered for the quotation:

***First they came for the Socialists, and I did not speak out—  
Because I was not a Socialist.***

***Then they came for the Trade Unionists, and I did not speak out—  
Because I was not a Trade Unionist.***

***Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out—  
Because I was not a Jew.***

***Then they came for me—and there was no one left to speak for me.***
