#### October — Month of the Holy Rosary

October is celebrated as the month of the Holy Rosary. Historians often attribute the connection between October and the rosary to the anniversary of victory at the Battle at Lepanto, which occurred in October of 1571, and the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. In 1571, Pope Pius V was said to have

prayed the rosary prior to the Christian forces of the Holy League, an alliance of Spain, Venice, the Papal States, Genoa, Savoy, and Malta, setting sail from southwestern Greece to battle the Ottoman Turks who were seeking to acquire Cyprus. The Holy League returned victorious and a feast day was declared with a rosary procession offered in St. Peter's square. Pope Leo XIII instituted the dedication of the month to the holy rosary in 1883.




