

Grace House Ministries Annual Fundraiser Dinner

On October 10th, I attended the Grace House Ministries Annual Fundraiser, representing the Knights and Saint Stephen Catholic Church. The event was attended by over 400 local pro-life leaders, including three of our youth. Gianna Jessen was the keynote speaker. As a baby in the womb, she survived a chemical abortion and was rescued by a nurse who understood the value of every life. Physically disabled, Gianna went through foster care but was rescued again by a

saintly woman who taught her to walk, and who also rescued over 50 other children in desperate situations. Despite having cerebral palsy and

other physical challenges, Gianna has an incredible faith, and is truly a pro-life warrior. She challenged all Christian men to take back our country from the forces of evil that are trying to build the culture of death.

Our State Rep Phil King also talked about progress in the pro-life movement in Texas. Recent legislation requiring hospital admitting privileges for abortion clinics has resulted in about 25 abortion clinics being shut down in Texas, including 9 Planned Parenthood clinics. Estimates are that abortions in Texas have been reduced from 80,000 per year to about 40,000, thanks be to God. As he mentioned, there is still much work to be done, since 40,000 abortions per year remain.

Grace House and other pro-life pregnancy centers have seen a dramatic pick-up in visits from women in crisis since many of the abortion clinics have been shut down. Grace House is raising

\$500,000 for a new center near the Weatherford hospital area on Foster Street. Grace House is a Christian, faith-based, pro-life center that offers

ultrasounds, counseling, pregnancy tests, parenting skills training, and other services for women. They also offer abstinence programs for local schools. Of the 359 positive pregnancy tests at Grace House, 356 chose life. Based on everything I have seen, I highly recommend we continue to support Grace House with our prayers, volunteer efforts, and funds. God Bless,

— Attention All 1st Degree Members — Major Degree Ceremony in Arlington on November 7th




Are you a 1st Degree member? Are you interested in advancing to the next higher degrees of the order? If so, here's your next opportunity!
