Hello Brother Knights,

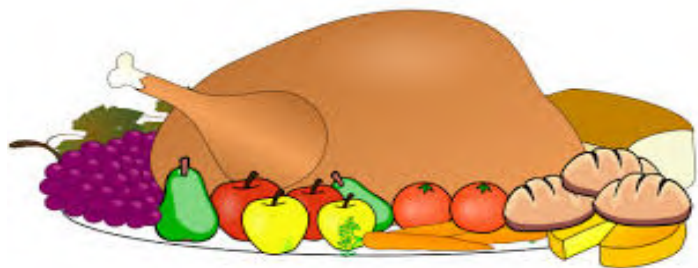
It is time to give thanks for all that has been given to us by God, our Lord, and hope we can continue to support all who ask for our help.

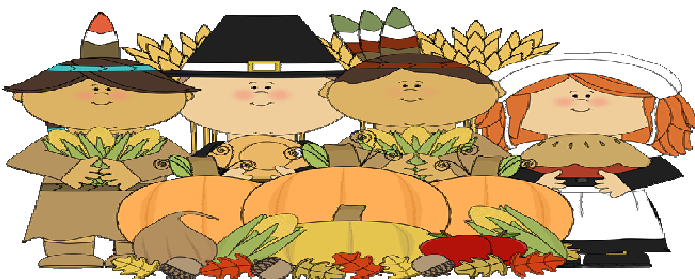
