SOUPER BOWL FOOD DRIVE – Ralph Paulus

Over 3 tons of food was collected through SUPER BOWL weekend. It was then distributed to twelve sites on Monday, February 8th. Total weight was 6394 pounds of food delivered to twelve food distribution sites. Thanks to all !!!!!!!! Great effort.

Frank Robinson made connections to all of the receiving organizations and many of the donating organizations. Mike Bailey gathered up boxes for packaging. Leo Hamilton and Peggy Birney coordinated the help for monetary donations and workers. Tom Green coordinated the deliveries. Everyone else donated food, collected money, helped pack boxes in the basement, helped deliver on Monday... or all of the above.



PRO LIFE – The Vanishing Abortion Clinic - John Baldo

Bloomberg Business reported on February 24 that, "Abortion access in the U.S. has been vanishing at the fastest annual pace on record." Their figures show that for every eight abortion facilities that close only one opens. Operation Rescue, with slightly different data, verifies this claim.

In a report released on December 22, that organization documented that 42 surgical abortion facilities closed or halted all abortion services during 2015, while 7 new ones opened. Surgical abortion clinics are declining at an average net pace of one every week-and-a-half. Since 1991, the number of surgical abortion clinics has fallen by 81%, from 2,176 to the present 514. And the trend continues.

In 2016, there already have been nine abortion facilities that have closed or announced imminent closures, although two are temporary. Medicine-only clinics, which dispense pills for first-trimester pregnancies, however, have risen to 213. Reasons for the closures include: the retirement of abortionists due to advanced age and declining health, with few young doctors entering the business; new state laws, such as requiring abortionists to have hospital privileges and clinics to meet out-patient surgical standards, have caused many substandard and dangerous operators to close; declining demand for abortions; continued strong public pro-life support; and public exposure of abortion abuses by pro-life groups. As we continue struggling to overcome a culture that has devalued life in Delaware and America, we would do well to recall the words of St. John Paul II as he concluded his visit to the United States in 1987:

"Every human person - no matter how vulnerable or helpless, no matter how young or how old, no matter how healthy, handicapped or sick, no matter how useful or productive for society is a being of inestimable worth created in the image and likeness of God. This is the dignity of America, the reason she exists, the condition for her survival -- yes, the ultimate test of her greatness: to respect every human person, especially the weakest and most defenseless ones, those as yet unborn."

"Day of the Unborn Child".

The Knights of Columbus annually recognize the Feast of the Annunciation as the "Day of the Unborn Child". As Knights, we are asked to pray on that day for the sanctity of all human life, that it be protected and defended. This year the Annunciation is celebrated on April 4, since March 25 is Good Friday.

Some of the history of this day follows:

The first official declaration recognizing a "Day of the Right to Be Born" came in El Salvador in 1993. The first "Day of the Unborn" was officially recognized in Argentina. Then-president of Argentina, Carlos Menem, established it in an effort to fulfill a promise that he had made to Pope John Paul II.

This celebration of life had its earliest beginnings in individual faith communities. Many priests and parishes saw the natural relationship between March 25th and the unborn child. The Feast of the Annunciation, on March 25th, celebrates the moment when the angel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary that she would be the mother of Jesus Christ.

In a written statement, Carl Anderson, the Supreme Knight said, õMay this day be the occasion for all of us to witness to the sanctity of Godøs great gift of life and to further resolve to protect and defend it.ö

That \$100 billion dollar number makes me smile because I know that bringing that number up, means bringing the number of unprotected widows down. I know that sometime in the not too distant future, 100 will become 150, and 150 will become 200, and subsequently the number of brother Knights left uninsured at the time of their death will decrease, the number of widows and orphans provided for will increase, and Catholic families will flourish, despite the odds, because of the diligent planning of a brother Knight . just as Father McGivney would have wanted. What a tremendous number. What a point of pride for you and for me.

For those of you that have given the Knights of Columbus the privilege of helping to protect your family financial future: thank you for your trust. For those of you that haven yet: there has never been a better time to turn to your Knights of Columbus. We are here to protect you, just as Father McGivney intended us to be. That is a claim that no other company can ever make. We are the premier Catholic insurance company, and we are yours.
