## Chaplain's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

During the month of November we are called in a special way to remember all of the departed souls. Our Catholic Church has beautiful traditions associated with remembering our deceased loved ones. We are taught that there are three states in which the soul will enter after death: Either Heaven, Purgatory, and Hell.

- Heaven of course is eternal glory. Sharing in the joy of the Resurrection with Christ. It is where we all want to be!
- Purgatory is a state of purification. The soul is assured of heaven, but must still undergo a process of purification and preparation before it can enter heaven. This is where our prayers matter! The highest form of prayer we have is the Holy Mass. Every time we come to Mass, especially during November, we are asked to pray for the souls in Purgatory. Our prayers help them and release them from their limitations, reaching Heaven more quickly.
- Of course, there are also souls in Hell. These are persons damned forever. We cannot pray for souls in Hell because they experience eternal punishment. Our prayers help them in no way.

However, we can pray for those who are still living including those who live lives not according to the commandments or to Gods law. We can pray they will have a conversion of heart so they can avoid Hell and make it to Heaven.

One of the famous Saints in our Church, St. Gertrude, was told by our Lord that every time she said the following prayer, 1000 souls would be released from Purgatory:

"Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen."

As Brother Knights, our commitment to prayer, to the Holy Mass, and to setting a good example for all to follow as Catholic Gentleman means a great deal. Our prayers and our examples matter! We will soon be approaching the Advent and Christmas Season. Let us remember how blessed we are to have such a loving and wonderful God who desires to save all of us and the entire world.
