


Tootsie Roll Drivel

Challenger Baseball is a baseball league for kids and adults with developmental disabilities from ages 5 on up. Since 1994 the main goal of St. Louis Challenger Baseball has been to make friends!

The fundamental goal of Challenger
Baseball is to make friends. As the players
who have disabilities play baseball they have
the opportunity to make friends with
teammates, who have disabilities, and
buddies, who do not have disabilities.
Buddies are kids and young adults (between
the ages of 10 and 20 who don't have
disabilities) who hang out with our players on
the field and assist them if they need a bit of
help.

How it Works: Beyond following basic safety rules, Challenger tailors certain rules to the skill levels of the players. Challenger players play on the same fields, use the same equipment, and wear the same full uniforms as traditional teams. Teams are supported by coaches and by the buddy system. As the buddies make friends they also help by pushing players using wheelchairs around the base paths after a hit or by helping a player retrieve a ball that's gets past them, among other things. But the most important thing a buddy does is to be a friend to our players.




