

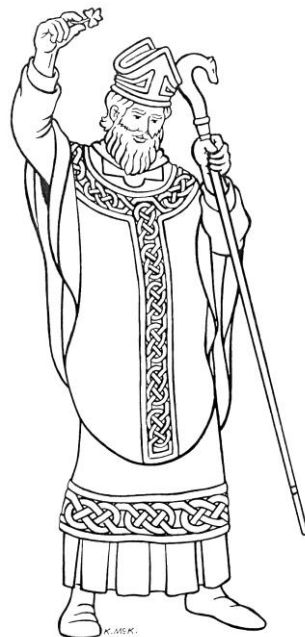

Irish Person of the Year 2016: JK McKnight



Mr. McKnight is a writer, musician, producer, fundraiser and activist and the founder of the Forecastle Festival & Foundation. McKnight started what is now an international attraction as a small community event at Tyler Park. Forecastle now has over 60,000 attendees from 2,100 cities, 49 states and 6 countries. Rolling Stone has deemed it one of the “Coolest Festivals in America,” with accolades from The New York Times, LA Weekly, Chicago Sun-Tribune, USA Today and others. Each year, the festival has an economic impact of \$14 million on the local economy.

The Forecastle Foundation is a non-profit dedicated to rebuilding the world’s biodiversity zones, some of the most highly-threatened reservoirs of plant and animal life on Earth, accounting for 77% of all vertebrate and 50% of all plant species. These zones play a vital role in regulating world temperatures. To date, the Forecastle Foundation has contributed over \$150,000 to protect these hot spots, which are both local and located around the world.

The Irish Person of the Year is the A. J. Ryan Division’s highest honor, and JK will serve as the Grand Marshall of the St. Patrick’s Parade, though it will not be his first parade. JK has marched many years with his father, Kelly, an AOH past president, and his mother, Ellen, a former LAOH member. J.K. and his wife, Holly, reside in Louisville.
