




- Financial Secretary Report

# Saint of the Month for January Saint Vincent Pallotti

January 22<sup>nd</sup> is the Feast Day for Saint Vincent Pallotti. He is known as a very modern saint who was responsible in part for the organization of numerous pastoral programs such as the Pious Houses that were refuges for orphan girls and babies, the hospice of San Galla that was a refuge for homeless men, and he founded the Pallottine Fathers and the Pallottine Missionary Sisters.



Saint Vincent Pallotti — 1795 - 1850

His founding of the Union of Catholic Apostolate called and inspired the faithful from all stations of life to minister to those who were most in need spiritually. He charged the members of the Union of Catholic Apostolate to treat those in need with charity, patience, humility, zeal, and with the love of God and Jesus Christ. Saint Vincent Pallotti was canonized by Pope John XXIII in 1963 and is the patron saint of missionary priests.
