A Brotherly Focus "Knight Races"- With Your Grand Knight and Council Webmaster

What do you think a retired trucking executive and a retired university chemistry professor have found that they have in common? For Grand Knight Leo Hoefer and our Council Webmaster Len Archer the answer is ---- NASCAR RACING. These two could be found together with 75,000 other fans enjoying the recent NASCAR spring races for both the Camping World Truck series and Sprint Cup Car series at the Kansas Speedway. Leo who worked full-time as an operations manager at a local warehouse also used to worked part-time pushing Sprint Cars at Knoxville, Iowa for racing teams in his younger years and even built and raced his own modified car a vintage '29 Model A Ford Sedan. Leo raced weekly for approximately 5 years at the local dirt tracks at Osborn. Mo and

Adrian, MO. Leo was very

competitive as a race car driver and is quoted as saying that: "It was much more profitable for me to quit racing than it would have been to continue at the rate that I was having all of my mishaps on the track."

Len, who taught university chemistry at MWSU for 47 years, has had a season ticket package for every NASCAR event at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City Kansas since its opening 15 years ago and usually attended with his eldest son. During a couple of those years Len's job as a chemistry professor led him to direct a non-traditional student (who also raced modified stock cars) in scientific research related to many aspects of NASCAR racing. The research involved both in-laboratory and ontrack studies of topics such as fuel formulations, rubber tire compounding, effects of heating and cooling cycles on tire performance, development of on-track engine oil analysis, use of tracer metals in race engine fabrication, and studies of traction control. When his son's job required him to move to Europe two years ago, Len looked for someone else to share his interest in racing. Leo eagerly accepted Len's invitation to attend the races and the two have shared their common interest at three NASCAR races to date. Their favorite drivers are Carl Edwards (#19), Kevin Harvick (#4), and rookie driver Ryan Blaney (#21). In the past Leo and Len both had working professional or racing affiliations with NASCAR driver Dave Blaney, who is the father of Ryan Blaney, one of the current leading contenders for NASCAR Rookie Driver of the Year.
