4th Degree (Patriotism Degree) - Kansas City, MO on Apr. Ist beginning at 10:00 am at the Airport Hilton Hotel in KCMO. (Special Honoree for this event will be Bishop James V. Johnston, Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph)

Council Knight of the Year and Star Council Awards Presented

The State Deputy also presented Council 15126 the Star Council Award for 2016 which was

Membership In Action (MIA) Plan Adopted By Council Officers

At the Nov. 15th planning meeting officers approved a Membership In Action (MIA) Plan which involves the division of Council members into 6 council teams (10-11 members each) formed to work toward improving attendance and member participation in all Council activities. Each of these teams includes at least two Council officers (one of which is appointed as team Captain), a number of more active members and a number of less active members.
