## Keeping Track of Your Volunteer Hours

As I am sure all of you realize, one of the most important aspects of being a Knight is the hours we all spend in direct service to our Parish, our School, our Council, our Township and our Nation. Collectively, Knights donate thousands upon thousands of hours each year for many causes and programs. Each year the Supreme Council asks each Council to submit their annual report of hours worked which is known as the Fraternal Survey. What you probably did not realize is that there is a very easy method of tracking your volunteer hours as you progress through the year. Your Council website can do that for you. Here's how you do that:

1. Go the Council Website located at [www.kofc5714.org](http://www.kofc5714.org).
2. Along the left hand edge of the landing page, click on "MEMBERS ONLY".
3. Enter your member number from your membership card.
4. Enter your Birth Date in the MMDDYYYY format
5. Click "SUBMIT".
6. As you scroll down the page you should see "Record Your Volunteer Hours and Visits.
7. Click on "POST YOUR VOLUNTEER HOURS & VISITS".
8. The next page that loads is the record keeping page. It looks challenging, but it really is not that bad. Find the "Date of Entries" heading and change the date to the date you did your volunteer hours.
9. Just below the date field are the preset Service Categories from which you can choose. Type a description in the field and enter your service hours & minutes in the appropriate fields and click the "SUBMIT ALL ENTRIES" button.
10. Best practice is to enter each separate volunteer service individually so you can change the date or the category for each service program.

That is it; quick and easy! If you get into the habit of completing the form after each service opportunity, you will quickly see how much time you are donating and if enough members use this system, the Council will be able to track total hours donated as well!
