IMPORTANT COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENT

At the October Business Meeting, a motion was put forth to donate one half of the net profits from the Oldies Night Dance Party event to the Home Association. The motion was properly seconded and passed by a majority of the members casting ballots at that meeting. The final Accounting of the event shows that the net profit from that event was \$1,617.07! Congratulations to Jack Ehmann & Gerry Stevenson on a job well done.

The agreed upon split of the profit between the Council and the Home Association would therefore require a check to be written in the amount of \$ 800.00 from the Council. However, after further discussion of several Officers, it was pointed out that \$ 800.00 is over the agreed upon disbursement amount of only \$500.00 as outlined in Article VII of the Council By-Laws. This Article clearly states the any amount over \$500.00 must be Approved by a 2/3 vote of members present and voting at a regular business meeting held subsequent to which the notice of the disbursement is made in writing to the membership.

NOTICE is HEREBY GIVEN that the disbursement of \$800.00 to the Home Association will be brought up again at the November Business Meeting scheduled for November 14th. Anyone who would like to discuss this disbursement and vote on it must be present at the November Business Meeting to do so.
